AN ACT

To enable the president and managers of the Fox Chase and Huntingdon turnpike road company to borrow money on mortgage, and to legitimate Isabella B. Houpt, of Montgomery county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the president and managers of the Fox Chase and Huntingdon turnpike road company, shall have full power and authority to borrow any sum or sums of money, not exceeding five thousand dollars, which may be necessary to enable them to complete their road, discharge the debts incurred in the construction thereof, and enjoy the full benefit of the privileges conferred upon them by the act of assembly authorizing their incorporation; any such loan to be upon such terms and conditions as the said corporation may deem fit, with power also to pledge and mortgage, as security for any such loan or loans, their said road and all and any of their property, real and personal, together with all their rights, powers and privileges and franchises; any sale or sales, under any judicial process to enforce any such pledge or mortgage, shall pass to and vest in the vendee or vendees whatever property, rights, powers, privileges and franchises may have been pledged or mortgaged under any such pledge or mortgage as last aforesaid.

SECTION 2. That Isabella B. Houpt, of Montgomery county, infant daughter of Samuel J. Houpt and Elizabeth, his wife, shall have and enjoy all the rights, benefits and advantages of a child born in lawful wedlock, and shall be able and capable in law to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever, as fully and completely, to all intents and purposes, as if she had been born in lawful wedlock.
