AN ACT

To incorporate the Spring Garden health insurance company of Philadelphia county; relative to the collection of taxes in the townships of Upper Leacock and East Hempfield, in Lancaster county, and relative to the Lewisburg University.

Provisions of 7th section of a certain act extended to Upper Leacock and East Hempfield townships, Lancaster county.

John Schrack, and James Moore, Jr., administrators of William H. Ludwig, M. D., dec'd, empowered to execute and deliver to the trustees of the university at Lewisburg, a deed for certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That James Steel, John S. Cash, James M. Davis, Thomas J. Jeffries, William G. Conrow, James Peters, Robert T. Fry, John L. Wolf, Stephen B. Fullerton, Thomas Borbridge, John G. Moore, George L. Heines and John J. M'Cahen, Samuel Allen and Robert Bethell, and all others who may hereafter be associated with them, be and the same are hereby incorporated in a company, under the name, style and title of "The Spring Garden health insurance company of Philadelphia county," entitled to all the privileges, and subject to all the restrictions and liabilities contained in an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Health insurance company of Philadelphia," approved the second day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight.

SECTION 2. That the provisions of the seventh section of an act, entitled "An Act authorizing the sale of certain real estate, and relative to the collection of taxes in certain townships in Monroe, Berks and Lancaster counties, and certain school districts in Butler, Franklin, Mifflin, Indiana and Schuylkill counties," approved the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, be and they are hereby extended to Upper Leacock and East Hempfield townships, in the county of Lancaster.

SECTION 3. That John Schrack, esquire, and James Moore, junior, administrators of the estate of William H. Ludwig, M. D., deceased, or the survivor of them, be and are hereby empowered on payment of said decedent's share of the purchase money, and other conditions performed by the trustees of the University at Lewisburg, as contemplated in a paper executed by said William H. Ludwig in his life time, together with Samuel Wolfe and James Moore, junior, dated May fifteenth, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, to execute and deliver to the trustees of the University at Lewisburg, in trust for said university, a deed for all the interest the said William H. Ludwig had at and immediately before the time of his decease, in a certain tract of land situate in the borough of Lewisburg, county of Union, and state of Pennsylvania, referred to in said paper, dated the fifteenth of May, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, containing seventy-three acres and seventy perches, neat measure, with the appurtenances, it being the same tract of land purchased by said William H. Ludwig, M. D., Samuel Wolfe and James Moore, junior, of Jackson Forseman and Mary his wife, by deed dated November twenty-eight, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and recorded in Union county, on the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in deed book M, pages one hundred and thirty and one hundred and thirty-one.

SECTION 4. That the said administrators, or the survivor of them, are hereby empowered on payment of the purchase money, to execute and deliver to the trustees of the University at Lewisburg, a deed or deeds for any land or lands said William H. Ludwig, M. D., in his life time contracted to said trustees for the use of said university, vesting in said trustees for the use aforesaid, such title as said William H. Ludwig had to the same at and immediately before the time of his decease. Further powers of said administrators.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Mine Hill and Schuylkill Haven railroad company."

WHEREAS, The increase and general interests of the coal trade dependent upon the Mine Hill and Schuylkill Haven railroad, will be greatly promoted by further extensions of said road and its laterals : Preamble.

And whereas, The capital to which the company is restricted, has been expended in the furtherance of the objects of their charter and its supplements ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That for the purpose of providing the means for making said extensions, and for other purposes hereinafter designated, they are hereby authorized to increase their capital stock from time to time, as may appear to them expedient, as has been done heretofore under the charter and its supplements, to an amount not exceeding eight thousand shares, the avails of which shall be applied as for the same may suffice to the purposes of this act, in such manner as the said company shall deem best: *Provided,* That the dividends on the increased capital shall be governed by the same rules and restrictions as are now by law prescribed for regulating the same ; and no dividends shall be declared upon any increase of capital, until after the same shall have been actually expended. Authorized to increase their capital stock. Proviso.

SECTION 2. That the extensions of the said road and its branches, and the other objects to which this act is intended to refer, are as follows, to extend their railroads from their present termination as follows: Extending their railroads.
up the West Branch of Schuylkill, any distance not exceeding five miles;
up the West West Branch of Schuylkill, any distance not exceeding five miles ; up the Muddy Branch, not exceeding two miles ; up the Swa-
