A N A C T

For the relief of Bogle, Hall and Bogle, late contractors on the North Branch canal; and relating to the Mutual insurance company of Warren county; and relative to Allegheny cemetery.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the auditor general be and is hereby authorized and required to examine the claim of Bogle, Hall and Bogle, contractors on section number sixty-five, Tunkhannock division, North Branch canal, and make report thereof to the present or next legislature. Auditor general authorized to examine and adjust the claim of Bogle, Hall and Bogle, contractors.

SECTION 2. That any three of the corporators of the Warren county mutual insurance company, may give notice by publication in a newspaper in the borough of Warren, that an election for officers of said company will be held on the first Monday of May next, who shall hold their offices for the term of one year, and until their successors shall have been duly elected. Election of officers of Warren county mutual insurance company.

SECTION 3. That the managers of the Allegheny cemetery, in Allegheny county, shall have full power and authority to contract for, buy and acquire title in fee simple or otherwise, for a lot or lots of ground in the city of Pittsburg, for the purpose of constructing a receiving vault for the dead of all denominations; and also connected therewith, a building for funeral service, if in the judgment of the managers of the said corporation, the same shall be proper and necessary. Allegheny cemetery, in Allegheny county, managers authorized to contract for and acquire lot or lots of ground, &c.

SECTION 4. That the said managers shall also have power and authority to contract for, buy and acquire title in fee simple or otherwise, for an additional number of acres of ground contiguous to the ground at present enclosed by the cemetery, not exceeding one hundred acres, subject to the restrictions and immunities in the charter of the said corporation: *Provided*, That the same shall be used only for burial of the Further powers. AN ACT

Supplementary to the several acts incorporating the Philadelphia, Germantown and Norristown railroad company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Philadelphia, Germantown and Norristown railroad company shall be and are hereby authorized to survey, mark, locate and construct a branch of their railroad from any point upon the Germantown branch of said railroad near Nicetown, to the most convenient point in the line of the Richmond branch of the Philadelphia and Reading railroad, east of the Schuylkill river, and for this purpose all the powers, rights, privileges and immunities conferred by the original act of incorporation of this company, and the several supplements thereto, shall be extended and made operative and applied to such track and branch: *Provided,* That before any expenditure shall be made by the company under the provisions of this act, the consent thereto of the creditors of the company shall first be obtained, or the approbation of the court of common pleas of the county of Philadelphia be first had, after due notice to said creditors shall have been given in two or more newspapers published in the city of Philadelphia, daily for two weeks.

SECTION 2. And it shall be lawful for said railroad company, by their agents and persons employed by them, to enter upon and take, along the branch hereby authorized to be made, or along the route of their present road, such lands, buildings and hereditaments as they may deem necessary for depots, sidings or water stations, or for access and egress to and from lands, buildings, or depots now owned or built, or that may hereafter be owned or built by said railroad company; and in case the railroad company cannot agree with the owner or owners of such property so required by the company, as to the compensation to be paid therefor, then the same course shall be pursued as directed for the settlement of damages by the original charter of this railroad company and the several supplements thereto: *Provided,* That payment of the amount
