AN ACT

Relative to supervisors in Franklin county; to elections of constables; to school district in Jefferson county; to voting in Mifflin county; to the extension of certain road laws in Susquehanna county; to the West Chester turnpike road in Delaware county; to prevent the destruction of fish in Somerset county; to township line in Mercer county; to East Brunswick school district in Schuylkill county; to Casely ferry in Warren county; and to hawkers and pedlers in Lancaster county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall hereafter be lawful for the qualified voters of Quincy township, in the county of Franklin, annually to elect three supervisors of roads for said township, at the time and place now fixed by law for the election of supervisors.

SECTION 2. That it shall hereafter be the duty of the supervisors of the several townships of Franklin county, to put up and keep in repair at the expense of the said townships, respectively, foot-logs or pathways over streams, at all places where said streams are not bridged at the crossing of public roads, said foot-logs to be erected at some convenient distance, not exceeding twenty rods from the said crossing place.

SECTION 3. That the several acts that have been passed, relating to the election of constables in the different boroughs, wards and townships, in the several counties in this commonwealth, shall be so altered and construed, as that each of the electors of each borough, ward and township, shall annually vote for only so many candidates for the office

of constables, as there shall be persons required to fill said office, in their respective boroughs, wards or townships; the candidates receiving the highest number of votes, shall be declared elected; and that all existing laws inconsistent with this section, be and they are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. That the farm and premises of Charles P. Cummings, in Pine Creek township, Jefferson county, and which joins the borough of Brookville, on the east, be hereafter attached to the borough of Brookville, in Jefferson county, for school purposes; and that the same be subject to the same taxation for the purposes aforesaid, as other property now in said borough of Brookville, is now subject.

SECTION 5. That the act passed the present session of the legislature, approved the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, authorizing the qualified voters of Adams and other counties, to vote by general ticket, be extended to Mifflin, Union, Crawford, Bedford, Monroe, Warren and Northumberland counties, so far as relates to voting at the general elections.

SECTION 6. That no informality in the tickets for assessor and assistant assessors, voted at the recent election in Cedar ward, in the city of Philadelphia, shall invalidate said election for said offices, but that the persons who received the highest number of votes for assessor and assistant assessors in said ward, shall be declared elected, notwithstanding any such informality.

SECTION 7. That hereafter the high constable of the borough of Stroudsburg, in the county of Monroe, who is now or may hereafter be elected for said borough, shall be sworn in and qualified in court as other constables of said county, and shall have all the powers and be subject to all the provisions of law relating to other constables of this commonwealth.

SECTION 8. That the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth sections of the act, entitled "An Act to alter the road laws in the township of Lenox, in the county of Susquehanna, and for other purposes," passed the third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, be and the same is hereby extended to the township of Brooklyn and Jessup, in the county of Susquehanna.

SECTION 9. That the president and managers of the Philadelphia and West Chester turnpike road company, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to construct their artificial road or any part thereof with plank, and to the full width of twenty feet as provided by the tenth section of the act incorporating said company, or to make two separate tracks, each of which shall be not less than eight feet in width, as the said president, managers and company may determine: *Provided however*, That if the eight feet tracks be used, the intervening space of four feet shall be filled with such materials as will secure and maintain a firm and even surface.

SECTION 10. That from and after the first day of May next, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to catch fish in White's creek, in Addison township, in Somerset county, with a seine or seines, net or nets, and any person offending against the provisions of this act, shall on conviction thereof before any justice of the peace in said county, pay a fine of ten dollars, with all costs, to be recovered by suit in the name of the commonwealth, the one-half to be for the use of the informer or informers, who shall prosecute for the same, and the other half for the use of the supervisors, to be applied to the repair of the roads in said township.

SECTION 11. That from and after the passage of this act, the Erie extension of the Pennsylvania canal shall be the dividing line between the townships of Salem and Green, in the county of Mercer.

Provisions of a certain act relating to hawkers and peddlers, extended to Lancaster county.

SECTION 12. That the real estate and all other property belonging to the fire association of Philadelphia, and the Washington hall association of Bristol, Bucks county, and all such dividends as may from time to time be declared by said companies, be and the same are hereby exempted from taxation except for state purposes.

SECTION 13. That all that part of East Brunswick township, in Schuylkill county, lying within the boundaries hereinafter mentioned, to wit: beginning on the Blue mountains at a spruce corner of the Berks county line; thence by a straight line to a corner of John Seltzer's land; thence along the line of said land to a corner on the Red mountain; thence by a straight line to the house now occupied by William Bolig, including the same; thence by the same course until it intersects the line of the East Brunswick school district; thence along said line to the West Brunswick township line; thence along the said township line to the Berks county line; thence along said line to the place of beginning, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate school district, to be called South Brunswick school district.

SECTION 14. That Seth Casely, his heirs and assigns, shall have the right and privilege, at their own expense, to make good and convenient landings on the east and west side of the Allegheny river, at and opposite the village of Tidute, in the county of Warren, and to use the said river between the said landings as a public ferry.

SECTION 15. That the said Seth Casely, his heirs and assigns, shall keep the said landings and ferry in good order and repair, fit for the transportation and passage of travelers, teams, and carriages of all descriptions; and shall keep good and substantial boats and other substantial crafts, and competent and careful ferrymen, who shall constantly, as occasion may require, attend for the purpose of carrying passengers, teams and carriages across said river with all reasonable diligence and care.

SECTION 16. The said Seth Casely, his heirs and assigns, as a remuneration for keeping up and in good repair the said landings and ferry as aforesaid, shall receive such tolls for carrying persons, teams, carriages, horses and other animals, as may be prescribed by the court of common pleas of Warren county, or one or more of the judges thereof: *Provided*, That nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to invest in the said Seth Casely, his heirs and assigns, the right to receive or discharge any travelers, cattle, carriage, or other thing, on land to which they shall not first secure the right so to do, except it be on the public highway; nor to prevent any future legislature from altering or amending this act; and that if a rope or wire shall be used in connection with the above, it shall be so constructed as not in any way to interfere with the navigation of steamboats.

SECTION 17. That the provisions of the act, entitled "An Act supplementary to the act relating to hawkers and peddlers, and regulating auctions in the county of Schuylkill," approved the seventeenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be and the same is hereby extended to the county of Lancaster.
