## AN ACT

To incorporate the Jenkintown and Fitzwater turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Spencer Shoemaker, Ardemus Stewart, Mark H. Evans, William Cottman, Isaac Scholfield, William Webb, Jonathan Tyson, Elijah Waring, Jacob Paxson, William Allen, John Mishener, George L. Wentz and Jacob Fitzwater, of Montgomery county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions and organize a company by the name, style and title of “The Jenkin-Style town and Fitzwater turnpike road company,” with power to construct a road, commencing at the village of Jenkintown, in Montgomery county, between Hallowell’s store and Peters’ tavern; thence extending generally in or upon or near to the present bed of said road, with full authority to alter and change the same to the village of Fitzwater-town, in said county, and to extend the same, if deemed necessary and advisable by said company, until the same intersects or connects with the Upper Dublin, Lewisville, White Hall and Nazareth turnpike road, at the most convenient and suitable place near the Three Tons tavern or Lewisville, which the said company shall find to combine shortness of distance, with the most eligible ground, subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine. Commissioners. Location.

SECTION 2. The capital stock of said company shall consist of three hundred shares, at twenty-five dollars per share: *Provided,* That the said company may from time to time, by a vote of the stockholders, at a meeting called for that purpose, increase their capital stock so much as in their opinion may be deemed necessary to complete the road, and to carry out the true intent and meaning of this act. ## AN ACT

To alter an act, entitled “An Act to erect the town of Minersville, in the county of Schuylkill, into a borough.”

Name.

Boundaries.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the town of Minersville, in the county of Schuylkill, shall be and the same is hereby erected into a borough, under the name and title of “The borough of Minersville,” the extent and boundaries of which shall be as follows: beginning at a spruce tree, for a corner, on lands now or late belonging to Bennett and Walton, adjoining lands of Wetherells and others; from thence south sixty degrees west one hundred and thirty-one perches to a white oak stump; thence north thirty degrees west sixty-three perches; thence north fifty-one degrees west one hundred and twenty-seven perches; thence north sixty-six degrees east one hundred and twenty eight perches; thence north sixty degrees to the division line between Bennett and Walton’s and J. White’s land; and thence south thirty-two degrees east one hundred and fifty-one perches to the place of beginning.*

SECTION 2. That the inhabitants of said borough, entitled to vote for members of the general assembly, and who shall have resided within the same for six months immediately preceding such election, and within that time have paid a county or borough tax, shall have power on the Friday preceding the third Saturday in March, in each and every year, to meet at the place where the elections for members of general assembly are held, or at such other place within the said borough as the council by ordinance may direct, and then and there, between the hours of one and seven in the afternoon, elect by ballot, one citizen residing in said borough, for burgess, to be styled “Burgess of the borough of Minersville,” and members of a town council, a town
