AN ACT

To prevent the killing of deer at certain seasons, in Union county; and relative to marriage certificates.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That hereafter it shall not be lawful to hunt, chase, or follow, with a design to kill or destroy, any buck, doe, or fawn, within the bounds of Union county, except between the first day of September, and the first day of January; and that so much of the act of assembly, passed the ninth day of April, seventeen hundred and sixty, as is hereby altered, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as relates to the county aforesaid.

Unlawful to kill buck, doe or fawn in Union county, except.

SECTION 2. That every person in whose care or profession may be found the record kept by any minister of the gospel, judge, alderman or justice of the peace, of any marriage contract solemnized by or in the presence of such minister of the gospel, judge, alderman or justice of the peace, shall, on application made to him, and the payment or tender of a fee of fifty cents in every case, deliver to the person applying for the same, a full transcript of the record or entry in such case, with a proper certificate of the correctness of said transcript; and any person having possession of such record as aforesaid, neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of this section, shall be liable to a penalty of fifty dollars, to be sued for and recovered with costs, before any justice of the peace of the proper county, by any person aggrieved, one half to be paid to the person suing for the same, and the other half to the county in which suit is brought.

Penalty for refusing to give a transcript of marriage certificate after tender of fees.
