A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An Act providing for the election of District Attorneys,"
passed May third, one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That any person admitted to practice as an attorney in the courts of the county in which he shall have resided one year next preceding, shall be eligible to the office of district attorney for such county; and so much of the act to which this is a supplement as is inconsistent herewith be, and the same is hereby repealed.*

Stephens, and James Chamberlin, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions, and organize a company by the style and title of "the Bellefonte, Walkersville, and Warriors' Mark Turnpike Road Company," with power to construct a turnpike road, commencing at the borough of Bellefonte, thence by the town of Walkersville, on the most eligible ground, to the town of Warriors' Location.*
