AN ACT

For the relief of Edward Garret.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer is authorized and required to pay out of any moneys in the Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to Edward Garret, of Delaware county, the sum of four hundred dollars, for damages for the destruction of his carriage and horses, by a locomotive running upon the Columbia railroad.
