

estate situate in said county of Delaware, which the said Leavin Cornish was, at the time of his death, seized or possessed of, or in any way entitled to, be and the same is hereby granted to, and vested in the lineal descendants of Margaret Garnett, the daughter, or supposed daughter, of the said Leavin Cornish, in the same proportions, and with the same interests, as if the said Margaret was the lawful issue of the said Leavin Cornish: *Provided*, Nothing in this act shall affect the right of this Commonwealth, under the laws relative to collateral inheritance.

AN ACT

Relative to the Supervisors of the township of Haycock, in the county of Bucks.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the supervisors of Haycock township, Bucks county, shall before entering upon the discharge of their duties, give bonds with security in double the probable amount of the public money they may receive, conditioned for the faithful discharge of their duties, which bonds shall be in the name of the Commonwealth, and for the use of said township, and the approval of them shall be, in writing, by the township auditors, who shall retain the bonds, no tax shall be collected by such supervisors until they have the certificate of the auditors that such bonds have been filed with them.
