This item disapproved.

Furnishing, etc.

The sum of twelve thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of maintenance; and the sum of five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of furnishing, equipping and making improvements in and about the said hospital.

July 18, 1901.—This bill is approved except as to the item appropriating \$5,000 for improvements to said building, from which I withhold my approval because of insufficient State revenue.

AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Pottsville Hospital.

Appropriation.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby specifically appropriated to the Pottsville Hospital, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred and one, for the following purposes, namely:

\$20,000 for maintenance.

For the purpose of maintenance, the sum of twenty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

This item is disapproved.

For the purpose of improving the real estate of said hospital and making additions thereto, the sum of fifteen thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Provided, That no part of the said sum of fifteen thousand dollars shall be paid by the State Treasurer until the managers of said hospital shall have certified, under oath, to the Auditor General that at least fifteen thousand dollars has been subscribed and paid to the treasurer of said hospital, for the erection and furnishing of a new ward for the said hospital.

July 18, 1901.—This bill is approved except as to the item making an appropriation for the purpose of improving the real estate of said hospital, from which I withhold my approval because of insufficient State revenue.
