

warrantees, dates of warrants, dates of surveys, names of patentees, dates of patents, together with such other important details as may appear on the original drafts; also county, township, city, and borough lines, where the necessary data can be conveniently obtained from official or reliable sources; said maps to be drawn on a scale or scales as nearly uniform as may be practicable, in order to clearly show the details of each of the several surveys embraced in any one county. Copies of original or special drafts, showing historical or topographical features of interest and value in connection with original grants and surveys, may also be included, together with such textual matter as the Secretary of Internal Affairs may deem necessary to a proper elucidation of the subject. *The Secretary of Internal Affairs shall make an atlas of such warrantee tract maps of each county, upon tracing linen, for permanent file in his office, and shall furnish a free blue print copy to the county commissioners and to the recorder of deeds of the county, and he shall sell to all persons desiring the same, blue print copies at a price to be by him fixed.*

Distribution.

Section 2. That section three of said act, which, as amended by said act, approved the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (Pamphlet Laws, two hundred and seventy-seven), reads as follows:—

“Section 3. That one copy of each atlas when published shall be forwarded by the Secretary of Internal Affairs to the offices of the county commissioners and the recorder of deeds of the county or counties contained in such atlas free of cost; two copies of the same to the State Library free of cost; two copies of the same to the Library of Congress, free of cost; and the remaining copies to be sold by said Secretary of Internal Affairs to applicants for the same, at cost of publication, and the proceeds thereof to be paid into the State Treasury at the close of each successive fiscal year thereafter,” is hereby amended to read as follows:—

Section 3, act of May 11, 1911 (P. L. 277), cited for amendment.

Section 3. The unsold copies of atlases heretofore published under the authority of this act shall be distributed at the discretion of the Secretary of Internal Affairs.
