AN ACT

Making it a misdemeanor for persons to unlawfully use or wear the insignia or button of the American Legion or the official decorations of said organization.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That any person who shall wilfully wear the insignia or button of the American Legion or the official decorations of said organization or use the same to obtain aid or assistance within this State, unless he or she shall be entitled to use or wear the same under the constitution and by-laws, rules, and regulations of such organization, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be fined not to exceed one hundred dollars, and, in default of payment, committed to jail for a period not to exceed sixty days.

AN ACT

Fixing the salaries of mine inspectors in this Commonwealth and the expenses incident to the office.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That on and after the passage of this act, the salary of mine inspectors of this Commonwealth shall be four thousand eight hundred dollars per annum, together with the necessary expense of performing his duties under the law, which money shall be paid in the manner now provided by law.
