APPROPRIATION ACTS

OF THE

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

No. 1-A.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to provide for the ordinary expenses of the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Departments of the Commonwealth, interest on the public debt, and the support of the public schools, for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred and nineteeen; and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen," as approved the sixteenth day of July, Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred and nineteen (Appropriation Acts, page thirty-four), providing for deficiencies in certain appropriations made to the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Departments by the act to which this is a supplement, and for other minor expenses, incurred or to be incurred to May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, by certain of the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Departments, not provided for by said act.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the following sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for deficiencies in certain appropriations made to the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Departments, by the act to which this is a supplement, and for other minor expenses, incurred or to be incurred to May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, by certain of the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Departments, not provided for by said act, be, and the same are hereby, specifically appropriated to the several objects hereinafter named, to be made in the manner prescribed by law, and to be paid. out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated: Provided, That all sums hereby appropriated shall be paid on the warrant of the Auditor General drawn upon the State Treasurer, unless otherwise prescribed by law: And provided further, That out of the amount hereby appropriated to the Senate and House of Representatives there shall also be paid salaries and mileages for any additional officers and employes for the session of one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, as may be authorized during said session.

Section 2. For the payment of the deficiencies in certain appropriations made to, and for other minor expenses, incurred or to be incurred, to May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, by, the following named executive departments of the State Government, the following sums, or so much thereof as may be

necessary, to be paid in the manner prescribed by law:-

Department of the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

For the payment of installing a card index system, by the Library Bureau, of sixty thousand domestic corporations and eleven thousand foreign corporations, registering and numbering the same, the sum of nine thousand five hundred dollars (\$9,500), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Auditor General's Department.

For the payment of clerk hire, messengers, and watchmen, including payment of special investigators, extra and temporary clerks, as the Auditor General may find it necessary to employ; the expenses of deputies, traveling auditors, and special investigators, while engaged on departmental business; payment of expenses collecting delinquent corporation taxes; for postage, expressage, and other incidental expenses; for the payment of mileage of mercantile appraisers; for the payment of costs in suits; for the necessary expenses of the department,—the sum of one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For the payment of the cost of advertising the State Treasurer's monthly statement of moneys in the several funds of the Commonwealth, the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or so much thereof

as may be necessary.

For the payment of deficiency for increase in salary of the Auditor General, as provided for in "An act fixing the salary of the Auditor General," approved the twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and sixty-five), the sum of one hundred sixty-six dollars and sixty-seven cents (\$166.67), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Treasury Department.

For the payment of deficiency in clerk hire, messengers, and watchmen, including payment of such extra and temporary clerks as the State Treasurer may find it necessary to employ for the purpose of balancing and transferring accounts, making new indices, listing and depositing receipts of the motor fund, or rendering any other general assistance to the regular clerical force; and for the payment of postage, express charges, traveling expenses of the State Treasurer or employes of the department, while on departmental business, and for other necessary expenses of the department,—the sum of thirty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$32,500), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For the payment of deficiency for increase in salary of the State Treasurer for the month of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, as provided for in "An act fixing the salary of the State Treasurer," approved the twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and sixty-five), the sum of one hundred sixty-six dollars and sixty-seven cents

(\$166.67), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Department of Internal Affairs.

For the payment of the deficiency in the appropriation for the salaries of officials, clerks, and employes in the Bureau of Municipalities in the Department of Internal Affairs, the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For the payment of the deficiency in the appropriation for the employment of draftsmen in copying surveys and other papers important to be preserved in the Land Office Bureau, as required by the act, approved the sixteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three (Pamphlet Laws, forty-seven), to carry on the work to May thirty-first, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the sum of four thousand dollars (\$4,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For the payment of the deficiency in the appropriation for the incidental and traveling expenses of the secretary and all other officers and employes of the department; for the payment of all postage, contingent and incidental expenses of the Department of Internal Affairs with its several bureaus, except the Bureau of Topographic and Geological Survey; for the payment of expert services and such other services as may be required for carrying out the intent and provisions of the various acts of the department,—the sum of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary; and the further sum of fifteen thousand three hundred and sixty-six dollars and thirty cents (\$15,366.30), or so much thereof as may be necessary, heretofore appropriated for salaries but unexpended, is hereby reappropriated for the use of the contingent fund.

School Employes' Retirement Board.

For deficiency in expense fund to be used for the payment of the salaries of the secretary, actuary, chief clerk, assistant clerks, and stenographers, postage, expressage, traveling expenses, contingent fund, and other incidental legal expenses, the sum of forty-seven thousand dollars (\$47,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For deficiency in contingent reserve fund, as provided for in section eight, paragraph three, of the act, approved the eighteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand and forty-three), the sum of one hundred ninety-five thousand dollars (\$195,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

For deficiency in State annuity reserve fund number two, as provided for in section eight, paragraph five, of the act, approved the eighteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand and forty-three), the sum of one million twenty-five thousand dollars (\$1,025,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Insurance Department.

For the payment of contingent expenses, and for traveling expenses of officers, actuaries, examiners, and inspectors, the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Department of Agriculture.

Bureau of Animal Industry.

For the payment of accrued indemnity claims for animals destroyed to prevent the spread of dangerous communicable diseases, the sum of sixty-two thousand nine hundred and sixty-five dollars and fifteen cents (\$62,965.15), or so much thereof as may be necessary.
