Section 3. That the [Board of Commissioners of Public Grounds and Buildings] *Governor, the Auditor General, and the State Treasurer* of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Mayor of the city of Philadelphia, and four other citizens of the Commonwealth, to be appointed by the Governor, are hereby constituted a commission to act in conjunction with a similar commission of the State of New Jersey as a joint commission for the purpose of constructing a bridge over the Delaware River connecting the city of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, and the city of Camden, in the State of New Jersey. No action of the said joint commission shall be valid and binding unless a majority of the Pennsylvania Commission and a majority of the New Jersey Commission shall vote in favor thereof.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, approved the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three (Pamphlet Laws, two hundred and three), entitled "An act authorizing the State Highway Commissioner to combine certain State highways, or any part or sections thereof, into a route under a common letter, name, number, or other marker or designation, or any combination thereof, for the purpose of informing and assisting the traveling public in and through the State," authorizing the inclusion of township roads in routes designated by the Secretary of Highways.

Township roads
may be included
in named or
numbered routes.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That in addition to the powers conferred by the act to which this is a supplement, the Secretary of Highways is authorized to include in any route designated by a common letter, name, or number, any improved township road or township road about to be improved, or to designate in like manner any such route composed wholly of improved township roads and township roads about to be improved.

Repeal.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.
