If any further adjustment of valuation is made by the county commissioners, after any tax is so levied and before said untion. tax is payable, such adjusted valuation shall be certified to the township supervisors and to the township collector of taxes by the commissioners, and the tax shall be collected on the basis of such adjusted valuation.

This article does not include the levy of any taxes upon particular districts, or parts of any township, for particular

purposes.
