Section 6. That section six of said act, which was section 6 as amended by secamended by section five of said act approved the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and eighty- amended. four), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 6. The city or borough council or the township supervisors or the township commissioners, as the Bonds. case may be, or the county commissioners, may issue bonds for the purpose of acquiring lands or buildings for parks, playgrounds, playfields, gymnasiums, swimming pools, public baths, or indoor recreation centers and for the equipment thereof.

was amended by section six of the act approved the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and eighty-four), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 7. All expenses incurred in the operation expenses of of such parks, playgrounds, playfields, gymnasiums, swimming pools, public baths, and indoor recreation centers, established as herein provided, shall be payable from the treasury of such city, borough, township, county, or school district. The local authorities of Appropriation. such city, borough, township, county, or school district having power to appropriate money therein, may annually appropriate and cause to be raised by taxation such tax, not to exceed two mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of taxable property in such city, borough, township, county, or school district, for the purpose of maintaining and operating parks, playgrounds, playfields, gymnasiums, public baths, swimming pools, and recreation centers.
