Compilers and clerks.

Section 5. The director shall also appoint a chief compiler, learned in the law, who shall be a skilled bill drafter; [and who shall receive a salary not exceeding forty-eight hundred dollars per annum;] a compiler and bill drafter, learned in the law; [at an annual salary not exceeding four thousand dollars;] a compiler and bill reading clerk, learned in the law; [at an annual salary not exceeding thirty-six hundred dollars;] a search clerk, learned in the law; [at an annual salary not exceeding three thousand dollars;] a messenger and file clerk; [at an annual salary not exceeding eighteen hundred dollars] a chief clerk, who shall be a stenographer; [at an annual salary not exceeding two thousand dollars;] a skilled reference librarian; [at an annual salary not exceeding twenty-four hundred dollars;] a secretary and [three] two stenographers. [at an annual salary not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars each.] The salaries and compensation of the employes shall be fixed, within the [maximum limits above provided] appropriations made biennially, by the director of the bureau, from time to time, taking into consideration the years of service of employes in the work of the bureau. The director may, for a period commencing one month prior to and ending one month after each session of the General Assembly, appoint and fix the monthly compensation of one bill book clerk, [at a salary of one hundred and seventy-five dollars per month, and] an assistant bill book clerk, [at a salary of one hundred and fifty dollars per month,] and such stenographers and emergency help as may be necessary [at a salary of one hundred dollars per month each,] to expedite the work of the legislative session.

AN ACT

To repeal sections one, two, three, four, five, six, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fifteen, seventeen, twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-seven, twenty-eight, twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-one, thirty-two of the act, approved the third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven (Pamphlet Laws, seven hundred eight), entitled "A supplement to the charter of the City of Chester."

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That sections one, two,

three, four, five, six, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fifteen, seventeen, twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-seven, twenty-eight, twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-one, and thirty-two of the act, approved the third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven (Pamphlet Laws, seven hundred eight), entitled "A supplement to the charter of the City of Chester," are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

To amend section nine of the act, approved the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand seven hundred eighty), entitled "An act to fix the salaries and compensation of the judges of Supreme Court, the judges of the Superior Court, the judges of the courts of common pleas, the judges of the orphans' courts, the judges of the Municipal Court of Philadelphia, and the judges of the County Court of Allegheny County," fixing the mileage for assigned judges.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section nine of the act, approved the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand seven hundred eighty), entitled "An act to fix the salaries and compensation of the judges of Supreme Court, the judges of the Superior Court, the judges of the courts of common pleas, the judges of the orphans' courts, the judges of the Municipal Court of Philadelphia, and the judges of the County Court of Allegheny County," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Assigned judges.

Section 9. When any judge learned in the law is called in, as now provided by law, to assist the judge or judges of any other judicial district, such judge so called in shall be entitled to receive for each day he is actually engaged in the performance of such duty, the sum of thirty dollars (\$30) per day and [car fare] *ten cents for each mile travelled to and from the place of holding court in such district.*
