AN ACT

To amend section five of the act, approved the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand seven hundred eighty), entitled "An act to fix the salaries and compensation of the judges of Supreme Court, the judges of the Superior Court, the judges of the courts of common pleas, the judges of the orphans' courts, the judges of the Municipal Court of Philadelphia, and the judges of the County Court of Allegheny County," by extending the provisions of the said section to the judges of the orphans' court of Dauphin County.

Salaries of judges.

Section 5, act of May 16, 1929 (P. L. 1780), amended.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section five of the act, approved the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand seven hundred eighty), entitled "An act to fix the salaries and compensation of the judges of Supreme Court, the judges of the Superior Court, the judges of the courts of common pleas, the judges of the orphans' courts, the judges of the Municipal Court of Philadelphia, and the judges of the County Court of Allegheny County," be and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

Common pleas and orphans' court of Dauphin County.

Section 5. The judges of the courts of common pleas of Dauphin County and the judges of the orphans' court of Dauphin County shall receive three thousand dollars (\$3,000) additional for trying civil cases for the Commonwealth.

When effective.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

Authorizing the election of officers of certain corporations of this Commonwealth, created by special act of Assembly prior to January 1, 1874, to be held in accordance with the provisions of by-laws duly adopted by their shareholders.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That officers of any corporation, created by special act of Assembly prior to January 1, 1874, which shall have accepted the provisions of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and classified its directors in accordance with the provisions of the act of Assembly approved the seventeenth day of June, eighteen hundred and eighty-seven (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and eleven), shall be elected, either by the shareholders or the board of direc-
