

AN ACT

To cede jurisdiction, to the United States, over lands embraced within the boundaries of Carlisle Barracks, located in Cumberland County, and over the tract of land and buildings occupied by the New Cumberland General Depot, located in York County.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the jurisdiction of the State of Pennsylvania is hereby ceded to the United States of America, for the occupation and use, for purposes of national defense, and for the erection and maintenance of the necessary buildings for the military or other public use of the United States, over all the lands now embraced within the boundaries of Carlisle Barracks Military Reservation, situate in Cumberland County, State of Pennsylvania, excepting roads abutting on said reservation, and that portion of the Carlisle-Harrisburg turnpike located within the boundaries thereof; and over all that tract of land comprising the New Cumberland General Depot, situate in York County, State of Pennsylvania, excepting roads abutting thereon, and those portions of the Marsh Run Road which lie within the boundaries thereof, and that portion of U. S. Highway No. 111 (old State Highway No. 333), which extends across the southeast corner for a distance of approximately two hundred seventy and one-half (270- $\frac{1}{2}$) feet.

Section 2. The jurisdiction, so ceded to the United States of America, is granted upon the express condition that the said State of Pennsylvania shall retain concurrent jurisdiction with the United States in and over the tracts of land aforesaid, in so far that civil process in all cases, and such criminal process as may issue under the authority of the State of Pennsylvania against any person or persons charged with crimes committed outside the limits of said lands, may be executed thereon in the same way and manner as if this jurisdiction had not been ceded. The United States shall retain such jurisdiction so long as the said tracts or parcels of land shall be used for the purposes for which jurisdiction is ceded, and no longer.

Section 3. That if at any time hereafter, any additional lands adjoining those above described shall be purchased by the United States for use of the said Carlisle Barracks Military Reservation or the New Cumberland General Depot, respectively, or for any other military purpose, this act shall be construed to vest in the United States jurisdiction over such additional lands to the same extent as is vested by this act over the tracts or parcels above described.
