

Section 1. AN ACT

Authorizing the State Board of Medical Education and Licensure to issue temporary permits to doctors of medicine legally licensed in other states to practice medicine and surgery in this State, under certain conditions, for a limited period of time.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The State Board of Medical Education and Licensure of Pennsylvania may issue temporary certificates authorizing doctors of medicine, legally licensed in other states, to practice medicine and surgery in Pennsylvania during the present war between the United States and any foreign country and six months after the cessation of hostilities. Such certificate shall be issued only to doctors of medicine who submit satisfactory proof to the Board that they possess a license issued by the authorized agency of the state in which they are licensed, and that such license is still in effect and has not been revoked or suspended; and further he or she shall furnish satisfactory proof that he or she is of good moral character, is not addicted to the intemperate use of alcohol or narcotic drugs, and has scholastic qualifications equivalent to those required by law in Pennsylvania, and is of satisfactory professional standing in the state from which he or she comes.

The provisions of this act are intended to supply medical services in communities where, because of the drain of war needs on such services that are normally available, there exists a need for medical services that may become a threat to public health. In order that this purpose shall be most effectively carried out, the Board of Medical Education and Licensure in applying the provisions of this act, shall cooperate with the Procurement and Assignment Service in Pennsylvania

of the War Man Power Commission and with the committee on War Participation of the Medical Society of the State of Pennsylvania, and shall give due consideration to the recommendation of either of such agencies.

All inconsistent acts suspended.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby suspended during the period it remains in operation.

Act effective immediately.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

To amend section four hundred and twenty A of the act, approved the seventeenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (Pamphlet Laws, six hundred eighty-two), entitled "An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and supervision of insurance carried by such companies, associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and repealing existing laws," by giving minors of the age of eighteen years and upwards full power and authority to make contracts of insurance or annuity with any life insurance company authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and to exercise all the powers, rights and privileges of ownership conferred on them under the terms of any and all such contracts applied for or issued to them, with the same force and effect as if they were of age.
