AN ACT

To authorize the State Reporter to waive the provisions of any existing contracts requiring volumes of the reports of the decisions of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania or of the Superior Court, to be stereotyped or electrotyped.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Penn-

sylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The State Reporter is authorized to waive state Reporter any provisions of any presently existing contracts requiring the volume of the decisions of the Supreme quirements to Court of Pennsylvania or of the Superior Court, to be stereotyped or electrotyped: Provided, That such cisions of waiver shall be on terms which the State Reporter shall, Supreme and Supreme Courts. in his sole discretion, determine are advantageous to the Proviso.
