AN ACT

Prescribing the persons who may administer the oath of office to the Governor and the Lieutenant-Governor.

Oaths.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Persons who may administer oath of office to Governor and Lieutenant-Governor prescribed.

Section 1. When the Governor elect and the Lieutenant-Governor elect are to be sworn into office, the oath or affirmation required by the Constitution shall be administered to each by one of the justices of the Supreme Court, or by a judge of a court of record learned in the law, or by any person authorized to administer oaths.

Repeals.

Section 2. The following parts of acts are hereby repealed to the extent *hereinafter specified:

Section 3, act of March 19, 1804, P. L. 330, absolutely.

(1) Section three of the act, approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred four (Pamphlet Laws 330), entitled "An act to regulate the administering of certain oaths," absolutely.

Section 2, act of March 24, 1874, P. L. 48 (No. 7), insofar as it provides for administration of oath of office to Lieutenant-Governor elect.

(2) Section two of the act, approved the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred seventy-four (Pamphlet Laws 48, No. 7), entitled "An act providing for the election of lieutenant governor and fixing his salary," in so far as it provides for the administration of the oath of office to the Lieutenant-Governor elect.

Inconsistent acts repealed.

All acts and parts of acts are hereby repealed in so far as they are inconsistent with the provisions of this act.

AN ACT

Authorizing, under certain conditions, the erection of a memorial chapel on the grounds of the State tuberculosis sanatorium at Hamburg, Pennsylvania, with private capital, the solicitation of such capital, and the acceptance of such chapel by the Commonwealth.

State tuberculosis sanatorium at Hamburg, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Erection of memorial chapel, with private capital, on grounds of such institution, authorized, under certain conditions.

Section 1. Any persons having the desire to provide for the erection of a memorial chapel on the grounds of the State tuberculosis sanatorium at Hamburg, Pennsylvania, through the solicitation of private capital, may form an association for such purposes. Such association shall have as its officers a president, secretary and treas-

urer, and such others as may be desirable. It shall register with the Department of Public Instruction, and comply with the act, approved the thirteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws 644), entitled "An act relating to and regulating the solicitation of moneys and property for charitable, religious, benevolent, humane, and patriotic purposes," and its amendments, notwithstanding any exceptions in such act.

Association formed for purpose to register with Department of Public Instruction.

Section 2. Such association may do all things necessary and relevant to soliciting donations of private capital, contracting for and erecting such memorial chapel. The plans for such chapel shall be first approved by the Department of Property and Supplies and the Secretary of Health, and the location of the building on the grounds of the institution shall be approved by the Secretary of Health.

Powers of association. ●

Approval of plans, etc.

Section 3. In such memorial chapel, as a permanent part thereof, there shall be a bronze plaque listing the names of the persons in whose memory the donations toward the erection of the chapel are made.

Names of private donors to be permanently listed.

Section 4. Upon erection of such memorial chapel, the Secretary of Health, on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, is hereby authorized and empowered to accept the same.

Acceptance of chapel.

Section 5. Such acceptance shall be made in such manner and in such form as is approved by the Department of Justice.

Manner and form.

Section 6. Upon acceptance, the Department of Health shall have full control, supervision and management thereof, for use in connection with the State tuberculosis sanatorium at Hamburg, Pennsylvania.

Control, supervision and management.

Section 7. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

Act effective immediately.

AN ACT

To further amend section 30 of the act, approved the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-one (Pamphlet Laws 522), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to dogs, and the protection of live stock, poultry, and game birds raised in captivity from damage by dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs by the Secretary of Agriculture; providing for the enumeration of dogs by assessors; regulating the keeping of dogs, and authorizing their destruction in certain cases; providing for the protection of licensed dogs, and for dogs temporarily imported for trial, show, and breeding purposes; prescribing certain privileges for hunting dogs and dogs owned or
