## AN ACT

To add section 14.1 to the act, approved the twenty-second day of May, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five (Pamphlet Laws 233), entitled "An act creating and establishing a fund for the care, maintenance, and relief of aged, retired, and disabled employees of the Bureau of Police in cities of the second class; providing a pension fund for said employees; and providing for the payment of certain dues, fees, assessments, fines, and appropriations thereto; regulating membership therein; creating a board for the management thereof; providing the amount, mode, and manner of payment to beneficiaries thereof, and for the care and disposition of said fund; providing for the payment into this fund by cities of the second class of all monies heretofore payable into any other funds, organizations, corporations, or associations having the same or similar purposes, and of such additional monies as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act," by providing for annuity payments to beneficiaries, in addition to pension payments, upon contributions by the beneficiaries.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The act, approved the twenty-second day of May, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five (Pamphlet Laws 233), entitled "An act creating and establishing a fund for the care, maintenance, and relief of aged, retired, and disabled employees of the Bureau of Police in cities of the second class; providing a pension fund for said employees; and providing for the payment of certain dues, fees, assessments, fines, and appropriations thereto; regulating membership therein; creating a board for the management thereof; providing the amount, mode, and manner of payment to beneficiaries thereof, and for the care and disposition of said fund; providing for the payment into this fund by cities of the second class of all monies heretofore payable into any other funds, organizations, corporations, or associations having the same or similar purposes, and of such additional monies as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act," is hereby amended by adding, after section 14 thereof, a new section to read as follows:

*Section 14.1. Any beneficiary under said fund shall, upon payment into the fund of the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200), with accrued simple interest at three per cent (3%) per annum from the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three, until the date it is paid, if paid after the fifteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three, but with no interest, if paid on or before the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three, be entitled to receive from the fund annually and for life, in addition to his regular pension, determined in amount as of the date of his*

Police relief and pension fund—cities of second class.

Act of May 22, 1935, P. L. 233, amended by adding, after section 14 thereof, a new section 14.1.

Annuity payments to beneficiaries, in addition to pension payments, upon contributions by beneficiaries.

Amount of additional annuity.

When such payments to begin.

Act effective immediately.

*withdrawing from service in the city, an additional annuity, pro-rated on a monthly basis, as a one-twelfth addition to the monthly payments due on his regular pension, sufficient in amount that the total monthly payments received by him for regular pension and additional annuity combined shall equal the amount of the regular pension which he would have been entitled to receive if he had withdrawn from service in the city on and as of the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three. Such additional annuity payments shall begin on the date on which the regular monthly pension payment is next due, after such contribution and interest have been paid.*

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

To amend the act, approved the tenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred forty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 30), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," by further providing for sabbatical leaves of absence and for contributions to the School Employees' Retirement Fund during such leaves of absence.

Section 1166, act of March 10, 1949, P. L. 30, as last amended by act of December 27, 1951, P. L. 1791, further amended.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section one thousand one hundred sixty-six of the act, approved the tenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred forty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 30), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," as last amended by the act, approved the 27th day of December, one thousand nine hundred fifty-one (Pamphlet Laws 1791), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 1166. Persons Entitled.—(a) Any person employed in the public school system of this Commonwealth who has completed ten (10) years of satisfactory service as a professional employe or member of the supervisory, instructional or administrative staff, or, in first class school districts, as a member of the instructional staff, as defined by the local board of education, shall be entitled to a leave of absence for restoration of
