AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to acquire a tract of land in Rush Township, Centre County, Pennsylvania, consisting of 9.93 acres, for use of Philipsburg State Hospital; and making an appropriation.

Description.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized to purchase, in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for use of Philipsburg State Hospital, a tract of land in Rush Township, Centre County, Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pipe, said pipe being the north-east corner of the Harry W. Parks property; thence along line of same north 62 degrees 30 minutes west a distance of 100 feet to a point; thence still by a line of same south 25 degrees 16 minutes west a distance of 180 feet to a point on the right of way line of State Highway leading from Philipsburg to Black Moshannon; thence along said right of way line south 79 degrees 14 minutes west a distance of 50.50 feet to a point; thence by land of A. C. Lynn estate north 63 degrees 53 minutes west a distance of 574.75 feet to a point on the right of way line of road leading from Philipsburg to North Philipsburg, known as Loch Lomond Road; thence along said right of way line north 26 degrees 7 minutes east a distance of 200 feet to a point; thence by land of Philipsburg State Hospital south 63 degrees 53 minutes east a distance of 407 feet to a point; thence still by line of same north 26 degrees 7 minutes east a distance of 623.75 feet to a point; thence still by line of same north 63 degrees 53 minutes west a distance of 230 feet to a point; thence still by line of same south 26 degrees 7 minutes west a distance of 50 feet to a point; thence still by line of same north 63 degrees 53 minutes west a distance of 186.78 feet to a point on the right of way line of Loch Lomond Road; thence along right of way line of said road north 26 degrees 7 minutes east a distance of 200 feet to a point; thence along line of A. C. Lynn estate south 63 degrees 53 minutes east a distance of 711.50 feet to a point on a line of Nathan Mull; thence along said line south 25 degrees 16 minutes west a distance of 771.22 feet to an iron pipe, the place of beginning; containing 9.93 acres, be the same more or less. And being a part of the same land conveyed to Austin C. Lynn M. D., by deed of Nathan H. Mull, Jr. and wife, by deed dated

Being clause.

June 6, 1942, and recorded June 19, 1942, in Centre County Deed Book Volume 173, at page 377. The said Austin C. Lynn M. D. died testate on December 29, 1949. For authority of the executors of the estate of Austin C. Lynn to convey the within described land, see Will Book "M," at page 394, in the office of the Register of Wills of Centre County.

Section 2. Such land shall not be acquired until title thereto has been approved by the Department of Justice.

Approval of title.

Section 3. The sum of three thousand dollars (\$3000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Property and Supplies for the payment of the purchase price of such tract of land and the expenses incidental thereto, including the completion of an abstract of title thereon.

Appropriation.

Section 4. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

To further amend the act, approved the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 2051), entitled "An act relating to public assistance; providing for and regulating assistance to certain classes of persons designated and defined as dependent children, aged persons, blind persons and other persons requiring relief; providing for the administration of this act by the Department of Public Assistance and county boards of assistance hereby created for this purpose; authorizing the Department of Public Assistance to cooperate with, and to accept and disburse moneys received from, the United States Government for assistance to such persons; providing for the liquidation of the State Emergency Relief Board, Boards of Trustees of the Mothers' Assistance Fund, and Boards of Trustees of Pension Fund for the Blind; and repealing laws relating to mothers' assistance, pensions for the blind, old age assistance, and the State Emergency Relief Board," by further prescribing the powers and duties of the Department of Public Assistance and the local boards; authorizing the Department and local boards to disclose the identity of recipients of assistance and amounts received; further defining "assistance" and those persons eligible for assistance; further prescribing residence requirements with respect to assistance; changing the terms of county board members; clarifying the provisions with respect to the payment to the United States of its share of moneys received by way of restitution; prescribing additional penalties; and repealing a certain act.
