

if it shall find that the leased *project is in conformance with general county and State plans for an orderly development of improved attendance areas and administrative units and for the improved housing of public schools in the Commonwealth, that the school building will conform with standards and regulations prescribed by the department with respect to educational design, location, usefulness for community activities, safety, comfort and convenience, and that the school district or school districts to which the project is to be leased will have the ability to meet from current revenues the rental or their respective shares of rental to be paid to the municipality authority or non-profit corporation under the proposed lease and to defray the cost of their respective shares of the cost of operation and maintenance of the project. *The department shall have the right to disapprove or approve with reservations a lease because of any failure on the part of the authority or school district to comply with the provisions of the laws of the Commonwealth relating to such authority or school district, only to such extent as will prevent the school district from paying a greater sum as rental because of such noncompliance with law. For that purpose, the department may require a modification of the lease, if not at that time executed, or may approve the lease with the reservation that the department will pay the reimbursement on that amount only which would have been determined by reason of the lower rental.*

Certain leases and approvals heretofore made validated.

Section 2. In all cases where leases referred to in this act have been entered into by any school district with a municipality authority or non-profit corporation and approved by the Department of Public Instruction prior to the effective date of this act, such leases and the approvals thereof are hereby ratified and made valid to the same extent as if they had been entered into and approved subsequent to the effective date of this act.

Act effective immediately.

Section 3. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

AN ACT

To further amend the act, approved the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 177), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative

departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," by transferring the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission from the Department of Commerce to the Department of Military Affairs and changing the membership of the commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts of follows:

Section 1. As much as applies to the Department of Military Affairs and the Department of Commerce of section 202 of the act, approved the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 177), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," as last amended by the acts, approved the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred forty-five (Pamphlet Laws 1015), and the sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred forty-five (Pamphlet Laws 1398), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 2. The first paragraph of section 407 of said act, as last amended by the act, approved the fifteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred forty-five (Pamphlet Laws 542), is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 407. Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission.—The Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission shall consist of the Secretary of [Commerce] *Military Affairs*,* who shall be chairman thereof, and eight other members to be appointed by the Governor. Two of the members shall be chosen from the House of Representatives and two from the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The members of the commission who are members of the General Assembly shall have no right to vote, but shall in all other respects enjoy all the rights and privileges of membership.

Section 3. The unexpended balances existing on the effective date of this act in any appropriation made out of any fund to the Department of Commerce for the use of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission are hereby transferred and appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs for the use of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the same purposes as expressed in the act making the appropriation, and any such unexpended balance is also hereby appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs for the payment of any bills incurred by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission prior to and remaining unpaid on the effective date of this act.
