Act effective immediately.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Amending the act of May four, one thousand nine hundred twenty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 519), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending, and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," increasing the maximum compensation payable to councilmen in boroughs whose population is more than five thousand.

"The Borough Code".

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1001, act of May 4, 1927, P. L. 519, amended July 19, 1951, P. L. 1026, further amended.

Section 1. Section one thousand one, act of May four, one thousand nine hundred twenty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 519), known as "The Borough Code," amended July nineteen, one thousand nine hundred fifty-one (Pamphlet Laws 1026), is amended to read:

Section 1001. Organization of Council; Quorum; Compensation; Eligibility.—The borough council shall organize at eight o'clock post meridian on the first Monday of January of each even-numbered year, by electing a president, treasurer, and secretary, which shall constitute the organization of council. The council may at the organization meeting elect such other officers as may be provided for by law or ordinance, or as may be deemed necessary for the conduct of affairs of the borough. The president shall preside over the meetings of council and, when absent, his place shall be filled by a president pro tempore. A majority of the entire membership of council shall constitute a quorum. The councilmen may receive compensation to be fixed by ordinance at any time and from time to time as follows: In boroughs whose population is seven hundred fifty (750) or less, a maximum of five dollars (\$5) a month; in boroughs whose population is more than seven hundred fifty (750) and not more than fifteen hundred (1500), a maximum of ten dollars (\$10) a month; in boroughs whose population is more than fifteen hundred (1500) and not more than twenty-five hundred (2500),

a maximum of fifteen dollars (\$15) a month; in boroughs whose population is more than twenty-five hundred (2500) and not more than five thousand (5000), a maximum of twenty dollars (\$20) a month; in boroughs whose population is more than five thousand (5000) and not more than ten thousand (10,000), a maximum of fifty dollars (\$50) a month; and in boroughs whose population is more than ten thousand (10,000), a maximum of [twenty-five dollars (\$25)] one hundred dollars (\$100) a month.

The population shall be determined by the latest United States decennial census or by two and one-half (2½) times the number of registered voters in the borough. No compensation shall be paid in any month to a councilman who has failed to attend at least one regular meeting of council during the month. A school director shall not be eligible to the office of member of council.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June twenty-five, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 928), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the sixth class," changing salaries of district attorneys in counties of the sixth class.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section one, act of June twenty-five, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 928), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the sixth class," amended October eleven, one thousand nine hundred fifty-one (Pamphlet Laws 1704), is amended to read:

Section 1. The annual salaries of the following county officers of counties of the sixth class shall be as follows:

The clerk of the court of quarter sessions, four thousand dollars (\$4000).

The treasurer, four thousand eight hundred dollars (\$4800).

The controller, five thousand dollars (\$5000).
