

Exchange.

Section 2. The aforementioned conveyance is made in exchange for a grant and conveyance of a tract or parcel of land situate in Union Township, Bedford County, Pennsylvania, being part of that tract now owned by A. Rush Burkett and more fully described pursuant to a survey made by Harry W. Cunard, a Registered Surveyor, on December 30, 1952, as:

Description.

Beginning at a concrete marker a corner of Blue Knob State Park northeastwardly along line of said park and lands of A. R. Burkett as delineated and depicted on that plat of a survey of December *30, 1952, by Harry W. Cunard, Registered Surveyor, No. 5389; thence from the initial point by 1952 magnetic bearings and distances North 33 degrees 45 minutes East 3098.3 feet, more or less, to a concrete marker; thence by same North 89 degrees 15 minutes East 17 feet to a plug and tack; thence by the lands of A. R. Burkett and parcel herein described South 33 degrees 45 minutes West 3099.5 feet, more or less, to a plug and tack; thence by same North 82 degrees 45 minutes West 17 feet to a concrete marker the point of beginning; containing 1.04 acres, more or less; said exchange being necessary for improved administration of Blue Knob State Park.

Deed of conveyance to be executed by Secretary of Forests and Waters.

Section 3. The deed of conveyance by the Commonwealth shall be executed by the Secretary of Forests and Waters in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Title of acquired land to be approved by Department of Justice.

Section 4. The title to the tract to be acquired by the Commonwealth shall be approved by the Department of Justice.

AN ACT

Amending the act of August nine, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five (Pamphlet Laws 323), entitled "An act relating to counties of the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," giving the board of commissioners additional powers with respect to the acquisition of real property and water drainage systems.

The County Code.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section one thousand nine hundred forty-seven, act of August nine, one thousand nine hundred fifty-five (Pamphlet Laws 323), known as "The County Code," is amended to read:

Section 1947. Prevention and Control of Floods.—
(a) The board of commissioners may borrow, appropriate and expend money, *and may acquire by purchase or dedication real property, or any interest therein*, for the purpose of cleansing, regulating, improving and controlling rivers, streams and other bodies of water *and storm water drainage systems* lying within the boundaries of the county, either in whole or in part, for the prevention and control of floods. They may make contracts and expenditures for the cleansing, *maintaining*, regulation, improvement and control of such waters *and drainage systems* and for the prevention and control of floods by storage or retaining reservoirs, or otherwise, in parts of such waters beyond the limits of the county or of the Commonwealth, when, in their judgment, such expenditures may be necessary and for the benefit of the county.

AN ACT

Amending the act of July twenty-eight, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three (Pamphlet Laws 723), entitled "An act relating to counties of the second class; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," giving the board of commissioners additional powers with respect to the acquisition of real property and water drainage systems.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (a) of section two thousand one hundred forty-seven, act of July twenty-eight, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three (Pamphlet Laws 723), known as the "Second Class County Code," is amended to read:

Section 2147. Prevention and Control of Floods.—
(a) The board of commissioners may borrow, appropriate and expend money, *and may acquire by purchase or dedication real property, or any interest therein*, for the purpose of cleansing, regulating, improving and controlling rivers, streams and other bodies of water
