AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Military Affairs to expend State funds for civil air patrol aviation, education, training aids and maintenance of civil air patrol aircraft, and making an appropriation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Military Affairs is hereby authorized to expend State funds for the purchase of civil air patrol aviation, education, training aids, books and equipment to defray maintenance and hangar rents of "on-loan" United States Air Force aircraft, to purchase or lease maintenance supplies and equipment for the communications network for the civil air patrol.

Department of Military Affairs authorized funds for certain purchases.

Section 2. No expenditures of State funds for such purposes shall be made unless a purchase order or lease is first approved by the Department of Military Affairs. Such funds shall be under the jurisdiction and control of the commission.

Purchase order required.

Section 3. For the purposes of this act, no expenditure of State funds shall be authorized by the Department of Military Affairs unless the purchase or lease is specifically for civil air patrol aviation, education, training aids, books and equipment, to defray maintenance and hangar rent of "on loan" United States Air Force aircraft of 190 horsepower or less, maintenance, supplies and equipment for civil air patrol communications network, and such administrative costs as may be approved by the commission.

Specific purposes of funds.

Section 4. The sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) is hereby appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs to be used for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act.

Appropriation.

Section 5. The act of July twenty-nine, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three (Pamphlet Laws 993), entitled "An act authorizing the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission to expend State funds for civil air patrol aviation education training aids and maintenance of civil air patrol aircraft," is repealed.

Repeal.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

Act effective immediately.
