AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P. L. 343), entitled "An act relating to the finances of the State government; providing for the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the Commonwealth, the re-settlement of accounts and appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth and imposing penalties; affecting every department, board, commission, and officer of the State government, every political subdivision of the State, and certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the Commonwealth," providing for the disposition of certain unused Commonwealth license forms, tags, buttons and certificates in the possession of county treasurers.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

The Fiscal Code.

Section 1. Section 204, act of April 9, 1929 (P. L. 343), known as "The Fiscal Code," is amended by adding, after clause (f), a new clause to read:

Section 204. License Fees.—The Department of Revenue shall have the power, and its duty shall be:

* * * * *

(g) *At the time of supplying the license forms and tags each year, to direct the county treasurer to (i) return at the expense of the department, or (ii) destroy or dispose of all unused dog tags which have been in their possession three years or more after the year for*

which they were applicable, to (iii) return at the expense of the department, or (iv) destroy or dispose of all other license forms, tags, buttons and certificates in their possession, three months after the accounts have been finally audited for the year the respective licenses were applicable. If the department fails to give such direction at the time herein prescribed, all license forms, tags, buttons or certificates, which have been in the possession of the county treasurer for the time herein specified, may be destroyed or disposed of by the treasurer.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, *1937 (P. L. 1225), entitled "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," authorizing hunting of deer or bear in dog training areas during open season.

The Game Law.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 938, act of June 3, 1937, P. L. 1225, added June 11, 1941, P. L. 115, and amended, in part, May 26, 1949, P. L. 1817, further amended.

Dogs may be trained at any time in certain areas by special permit.

Section 1. Section 938, act of June 3, 1937 (P. L. 1225), known as "The Game Law," added June 11, 1941 (P. L. 115), and amended, in part, May 26, 1949 (P. L. 1817), is amended to read:

Section 938. Special Dog Training Areas.—(a) Upon application of any club or organization having twenty or more members who are citizens of this Commonwealth, or upon the application of twenty or more citizens of this Commonwealth and the payment of a registration fee of ten dollars (\$10), the commission may issue a permit authorizing the establishment and maintenance by such club, organization or citizens on land owned by them, or over which they have legal control, of a special dog training area wherein and whereon dogs may be trained at any time during the entire year. No such dog training area shall be of less than one hundred acres, nor of more than two hundred fifty acres, nor shall permits be issued for more than six special dog training areas in any one county.

Persons granted permit required to stock areas.

(b) The permittees shall from time to time during each year stock twenty-five pieces of game per one hundred acres at their own expense under the supervision of the Game Commission, [and] unless the commission shall determine that the area is already adequately
