

Appropriation.

Section 4. The sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) is hereby appropriated to be paid into the "Employment Fund for the Blind" for use by the [State Council for the Blind] *Department of Public Welfare* in carrying out the purposes of this act.

Act effective immediately.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to acquire, by gift, on behalf of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the historic property known as the Tuscarora Academy, and authorizing the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to restore the same, and to enter into an agreement with the Tuscarora Academy Preservation Commission, Inc., for the management and maintenance of the same, and making an appropriation.

Real property.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Department of Property and Supplies authorized to accept gift of real estate and property in Juniata County, known as Tuscarora Academy.

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies is hereby authorized to acquire on behalf of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, by gift, the historic property and surrounding grounds, known as the Tuscarora Academy, in Juniata County.

Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission authorized to restore and repair the property.

Section 2. The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, upon acquisition, is hereby authorized to arrange for the proper repair and restoration of the building and grounds of said property.

Tuscarora Academy Preservation Commission, Inc. authorized to manage and maintain property as an historical shrine.

Section 3. When repair and restoration of said property has been completed, the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the nonprofit educational corporation, known as the Tuscarora Academy Preservation Commission, Inc., for the permanent management and maintenance of said property as an historical shrine memorializing the history of this distinguished academy.

Appropriation.

Section 4. The sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to be utilized for the repair and restoration of this property.
