

[Nonresident hunter's license shall entitle the holder to hunt, take or kill all wild birds and wild animals which may legally be hunted, taken or killed in this Commonwealth, twenty dollars (\$20).]

Nonresident trapper's license which shall be issued only upon application to the Commission in Harrisburg and which shall be effective for the same period as hunter's licenses shall entitle the holder to take through the use of traps or deadfalls only wild birds and wild animals which may legally be trapped in this Commonwealth, except beavers, twenty-five dollars (\$25). Nothing in this clause shall be construed to prohibit the holder of a nonresident trapper's license from using a sidearm or a rifle not larger than a .22 rimfire caliber to kill legally caught birds and animals.

Every alien nonresident of this Commonwealth who is also a nonresident of the United States, upon written application made to the Department of Revenue, setting forth satisfactory evidence of his mental and physical fitness to carry and use firearms, unless any such person has been disqualified for a license in the manner hereinafter specified, and upon the payment to the Department of Revenue of the fees above designated for non-residents shall be entitled to a nonresident hunter's license, and the proper tag issued therewith, but the Department of Revenue shall indicate on the face of the license that the holder is an alien nonresident.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to sell 59.514 acres, more or less, of land situate in West Chillisquaqua Township, Northumberland County.

Real property.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to sell at public sale to the highest bidder the following described tract of land in the Township of West Chillisquaqua, County of Northumberland and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

<p>Beginning at a point on the easterly right-of-way line of Legislative Route 18, said point being Sixty (60) feet distant from and at right angles to Center line Station 19+82.08; thence along the easterly right-of-way line of said Route the following courses and distances, North 76° 26' West for a distance of Two Hundred Fifty-two and Seventy-three Hundredths (252.73) feet to a stake; thence by a curve to the right having a radius of Five Hundred Thirteen and Sixty-nine Hundredths (513.69) feet a distance of Two Hundred Seventy-three and Sixty-two Hundredths (273.62) feet to a stake; thence North 45° 52' West a distance of Four Hundred Fifty-eight and Fifty Hundredths (458.50) feet to a stake; thence by a curve to the left having a radius of Eight Hundred Seventy-nine and Two Hundredths (879.02) feet a distance of Two Hundred Fifty-three and No Hundredths (253.00) feet to a stake; thence North 62° 22' West a distance of Three Hundred Nine and Thirty-three Hundredths (309.33) feet to a stake; thence by a curve to the right having a radius of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Four and Ninety-three *Hundredths (2804.93) feet to a stake; thence North 57° 32' West a distance of One Hundred Ninety-six and Seventy-eight Hundredths (196.78) feet to a stake; thence by a curve to the right having a radius of Seven Hundred Fifty-nine and Two Hundredths (759.02) feet a distance of Two Hundred Fifty-four and Seventeen Hundredths (254.17) feet to a stake; thence North 38° 21' West a distance of Six Hundred Seventeen and Seventy-nine Hundredths (617.79) feet to a stake said stake being Sixty (60) feet distant from and at right angles to Center Line Station 435+08.09; thence due East a distance of Two Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-one and Ninety-five Hundredths (2431.95) feet to a sandstone monument; thence South 5° 45' East a distance of One Hundred Ninety-three and No Hundredths (193.00) feet to a sandstone monument; thence South 3° 25' East a distance of Six Hundred Ninety-four and No Hundredths (694.00) feet to a stake; thence South 3° 40' East a distance of Six Hundred Thirty and No Hundredths (630.00) feet to a sandstone monument; thence South 61° 15' West a distance of Three Hundred Forty-three and Fourteen Hundredths (343.14) feet to a stake on the easterly right-of-way line the point of beginning, containing Fifty-nine and Five Hundred Fourteen Thousandths (59.514) acres, more or less.</p>	

Being part of the same premises acquired by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from Clyde S. and Mary E. Miller by deed, dated October 16, 1925, and recorded in Northumberland County deed book volume 220, page 385.

Conditions.

The conveyance shall be made under and subject, nevertheless, to all easements, servitudes and rights of others, including but not confined to streets, roadways and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas or pipe line companies as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estate or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Approval and execution of deed.

Section 2. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Disposition of proceeds.

Section 3. All moneys received from the sale of the land herein authorized to be conveyed shall be deposited in the General Fund.

Act effective immediately.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Amending the act of May 21, 1943 (P. L. 328), entitled "An act authorizing the Secretary of Highways, at the request of, and under agreement with the Public Roads Administration of the United States, to lay out, establish, construct and maintain flight strips and roads to the sites of war activities, or to replace roads or streets which have been closed by defense or military activities, and to condemn property for such purposes, authorizing a width of two hundred feet for such roads in certain cases; and making an appropriation," further regulating payment of property damages by the Department of Highways.

Road construction to facilitate war effort.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:
