AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," giving State Colleges powers to cooperate with and accept grants and assistance to prosecute research projects and programs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Public School Code of 1949.

Section 1. Article XX., act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," is amended by adding, at the end thereof, a new section to read:

Article XX., act of March 10, 1949, P. L. 30, amended by adding a new section 2012.

ARTICLE XX.

STATE [TEACHERS'] COLLEGES

\* \* \*

*Section 2012. Research Projects, Authority to Accept Grants.—The trustees of any State College, with the approval of the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Governor, shall have the power to cooperate with and accept grants and assistance from Federal and State agencies, foundations and industrial corporations in the prosecution of research projects or programs.*

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to acquire land for use of Selingsgrove State School in Penns Township, Snyder County, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Real Property.

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized to purchase, on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for use of the Selingsgrove State School, all, or any number less than all, of the tracts of land in Penns Township, Snyder County, bounded and described as follows:

Department of Property and Supplies, with approval of Governor, authorized to purchase certain land in Penns Township, Snyder County.

Tract No. 1. Beginning at an oak on the south side of a public road leading from Penns Creek to Hermans lime kiln; thence south 1/2 degree east 252.5 feet to an oak; thence south 70 1/2 degrees east 110 feet to a post;
