Section 3, act of April 18, 1929, P. L. 609, amended September 23, 1959, P. L. 943, further amended.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 3, act of April 18, 1929 (P. L. 609), entitled "An act providing for the location, care and maintenance of graves of soldiers, sailors, marines, and members of the enlisted nurse corps; and for the compilation and preservation of records relating to such soldiers, sailors, marines, and members of the enlisted nurse corps, and their burial places, by county commissioners, at the expense of the counties; and imposing certain duties upon persons, firms, corporations, and municipalities, owning and controlling cemeteries; conferring certain duties on the Department of Military Affairs," amended September 23, 1959 (P. L. 943), is amended to read:

Collection of data by military services.

Section 3. For the purpose of locating the burial places of persons who have served in the military or naval service, or other branches of the combative forces of the United States during any war in which the United States was engaged, the Grand Army of the Republic, the United Spanish War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, the American Legion, the Italian American [World] War Veterans of the United States, Incorporated, [Department of Pennsylvania] and the Disabled American Veterans of the World War, through their local camps, posts and branches in this State, are authorized, without expense to the county, to collect the required data, and prepare and file with the county commissioners or the city *commissioners of cities of the first class certificates embodying the information provided for in section one hereof.

AN ACT

Amending the act of April 8, 1867 (P. L. 50), entitled "An act to permit disabled soldiers to peddle by procuring a license therefor, without charge," correcting the name of the Italian

American World War Veterans of the United States, Incorporated, to conform with name in its charter.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of April 8, 1867 (P. L. 50), entitled "An act to permit disabled soldiers to peddle by procuring a license therefor, without charge," amended August 10, 1959 (P. L. 657), is amended to read:

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That every honorably discharged soldier, sailor, and marine, of the military or naval service of the United States, who is a resident of this State, and who is unable to procure a livelihood by manual labor, shall have the right to hawk, peddle, and vend any goods, wares, or merchandise, or solicit trade within this Commonwealth, by procuring a license for that purpose, to be issued without cost: Provided, That before any such soldier, sailor, or marine shall be entitled to the benefits of this act, he shall *present his certificate of pension or satisfactory proof that he receives compensation from the Federal Government, which shall be evidence of his disability; if no pensioner nor a receiver of compensation, he shall present a certificate from two reputable physicians that he is unable to procure his living by manual labor. He shall also procure a certificate from the prothonotary of any county in this State that he has filed, in the office of said prothonotary, his affidavit, setting forth that he is the bona fide owner in his own right of all the goods, wares, and merchandise which he proposes to hawk, peddle, and vend, and that he will not engage to sell the same for any other person or persons whatever, and that he will not sell, or attempt to sell, the labeled artificial flowers of the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Spanish American War Veterans, Italian American [World] War Veterans of the United States, Incorporated, Disabled American Veterans of the World War, and the American Veterans of World War II (AMVETS), namely the poppy, carnation, and buddy poppy, the forget-me-not, the white clover, and the daisy, and that he will not sell, or offer to sell, miniature American flags: And provided further, That the aforesaid certificate or proof of compensation, together with such person's discharge from the military or naval service, or an exemplified copy thereof, shall be full and conclusive evidence of such person's rights to the benefits of this act. The prothonotary, issuing such certificate, shall require the applicant to furnish two photographs of the applicant, each bearing the signature of the applicant. One photograph shall be filed with the

application, the other shall be attached to the certificate, when issued.

Use of certificate by anyone other than applicant prohibited.

The use of such certificate by anyone, other than the applicant, shall nullify such certificate, and shall nullify the privileges, under this act, of the applicant permitting such measure.

Penalty.

Any person who shall peddle contrary to the provisions of this act, or in violation of the affidavit which he made to obtain such license shall, upon conviction in a summary proceeding, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50), and in default of the payment of such fine and costs shall be sentenced to imprisonment for a term of ten (10) days.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Secretary of Public Welfare and the Governor, to grant to Upper St. Clair Township, Allegheny County, its successors or assigns, a right-of-way for the purpose of constructing, installing and maintaining a sanitary sewer system over property of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, known as the Mayview State Hospital Property.

Real property.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Department of Property and Supplies, with approval of Secretary of Public Welfare and Governor, authorized to convey certain right-of-way or easement, in Upper St. Clair and South Fayette Townships, Allegheny County.

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Secretary of Public Welfare and the Governor, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to grant and convey to Upper St. Clair Township, a municipal subdivision of this Commonwealth, located in Allegheny County, a right-of-way or easement for the purpose of constructing, installing and maintaining a sanitary sewer system, or for the purpose of having the same constructed, installed and maintained, in the property of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, known as the Mayview State Hospital Property, located partially in Upper St. Clair Township and partially in South Fayette Township, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania. The said grant and conveyance shall provide that Upper St. Clair Township, its successors or assigns, shall have the right to use a *right-of-way or easement forty (40') feet wide for construction and installation and twenty (20') feet wide for maintenance of said sanitary sewer system, which shall be located as follows:
