

the clock in the afternoon of the same day, *nor shall anything herein contained be construed to prohibit the production and performance of drama and civic light opera in cities of the second class on Sundays, between the hours of two o'clock post meridian and twelve o'clock midnight, by nonprofit corporations in such cities, with right to charge admission. The hours prescribed by this section shall be daylight saving time in any such city during such part of the year when daylight saving time may be observed generally in such city.*

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Governor to provide for disaster relief under certain circumstances; authorizing him to transfer certain funds to a special fund for that purpose, and making an appropriation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Disaster relief.

Section 1. Whenever during the interim between sessions of the General Assembly, the Governor finds as a fact that a disaster has occurred in Pennsylvania, he shall have power to transfer any unused funds which had been appropriated for the ordinary expenses of the government to a special fund for disaster relief to be expended in such manner as the Governor shall determine, and such funds are hereby appropriated to the Governor for such purpose. The total of such transfers shall never exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) in any one year.

Governor granted power between sessions of General Assembly to transfer certain funds for disaster relief.

As used in this act, disaster or emergency conditions shall mean those conditions which seriously affect the welfare of a substantial number of citizens of the Commonwealth and which were caused by forces beyond the control of man or were caused by factors that were not foreseen and were not known to exist when appropriation bills were enacted.

Definition of "disaster."

As used in this act, a major disaster occurs or emergency conditions exist, when the Governor officially proclaims that he has made an investigation and finding to that effect, and shall cease, when the Governor officially

proclaims that a major disaster or emergency conditions ceases to exist.

Effective date.

Section 2. This act shall take effect June 1, 1961.

AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code, the Tractor Code, the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership, possession and use of vehicles and tractors," changing registration fees for motor buses and motor omnibuses operated by mass transportation systems.

The Vehicle Code.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 710.1, act of April 29, 1959, P. L. 58, added December 1, 1959, P. L. 1626, further amended.

Section 1. Section 710.1, act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), known as "The Vehicle Code," added December 1, 1959 (P. L. 1626), is amended to read:

Section 710.1. Motor Vehicles Operated by Mass Transportation Systems.—The fee for annual registration of each motor bus and motor omnibus operated by mass transportation systems shall be [one-half the fee prescribed for annual registration of motor buses and motor omnibuses in section 709 and section 710] *sixteen dollars (\$16.00)*.

Effective date.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to the registration year beginning June 1, 1961, and each year thereafter.
