## AN ACT

To prohibit operation of boats having a developed horsepower rating in excess of six on Sugar Lake in Crawford County.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Sugar Lake,  
Crawford  
County.

Section 1. No boat equipped with a motor having a developed horsepower rating in excess of six shall be operated on Sugar Lake in Crawford County.

Motor boat in  
excess of 6 H.P.  
prohibited.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall, upon summary conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50) and costs of prosecution, or, in default of the payment thereof, to undergo imprisonment for not more than twenty (20) days.

Penalty.

Section 3. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.

## AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Highways, with the approval of the Governor, to erect and maintain a bridge over the Susquehanna River in Dauphin and Perry Counties and to provide the necessary approaches and connections with State highways; empowering counties to pay certain damages; and making an appropriation therefor.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Bridge con-  
struction.

Section 1. The Department of Highways, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized to erect and construct a bridge beginning in Dauphin County from a point in or near the Borough of Millersburg over the Susquehanna River to a point on the opposite side of said river in Perry County.

Section 2. In the construction of said bridge and the approaches thereto and connections with State highways, the Department of Highways shall have all of the powers and authority conferred with respect to the relocation, widening or construction of State highways, including the exercise of the power of eminent domain.
