

Revenue shall indicate on the face of the license that the holder is an alien nonresident.

Section 2. The increase in license fees provided for in this amending act shall be applicable to licenses issued for the license period beginning September 1, 1963. **Applicability.**

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to sell and convey real property situate in Mahoning Township, Montour County, with the approval of the Governor.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: **Real property.**

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to sell, at public sale to the highest bidder, the following described tract of land situate in the Township of Mahoning, County of Montour and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows: **Department of Property and Supplies, with approval of Governor, authorized to sell certain land in Mahoning Township, Montour County.**

Beginning at a stone corner of lands of the State Hospital for the Insane at Danville, Pennsylvania; thence along the same and land now or formerly of John D. Williams south $17\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east 48.75 perches to a post; thence along the School House lot south 20 degrees west 1.03 perches to a post in the public road; thence in said public road and along land now or formerly of John F. Deibert north 85 degrees west 4.55 perches to a stone corner of lands of the State Hospital for the Insane; thence along the same and in the public road, the following four courses, to wit: north $10\frac{1}{4}$ degrees east 2.8 perches to a stone corner, north 69 degrees west 12.55 perches to a stone corner, north $3\frac{1}{4}$ degrees west 28.6 perches to a stone corner, north $15\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east 11.7 perches to the stone the place of beginning, containing 2 acres and 61 perches of land. **Description.**

Being the same premises conveyed to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by deed of Darlis J. Heimbach et al., recorded in Montour County Deed 59, page 379, on September 28, 1950. **Recorded.**

The conveyance shall be made under and subject, nevertheless, to all easements, servitudes and rights of **Restrictions.**

others, including but not confined to streets, roadways and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas or pipe line companies as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estates or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Approval and execution.

Section 2. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Disposition of proceeds.

Section 3. All moneys received from the sale of the land herein authorized to be conveyed shall be deposited in the General Fund.

Act effective immediately.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Authorizing an incoming Governor to arrange for temporary staffing to expedite the transition of government, and providing for an appropriation in certain years.

Governor elect.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Personnel authorized; procedures and limitations of employment.

Section 1. In order that there may be an orderly, efficient and economical transition of government following the election of a new Governor, the Auditor General, in the fiscal year during which a new Governor is elected, is hereby authorized to employ such consultants, accountants and experts as shall have been selected in writing by the new Governor who is hereby authorized to fix the compensation to be paid such personnel. Such notice to the Auditor General shall be given at any time after the Secretary of the Commonwealth and the Auditor General have determined the person receiving the highest number of votes for the office of Governor and have informed the new Governor-elect of such determination. Since this personnel is to be engaged for a limited period of time, they shall not be eligible for membership in any of the retirement systems of the Commonwealth, nor shall they be bound by or subject to the provisions of "The Administrative Code of 1929" pertaining to State employes. Such personnel shall be paid from an appropriation not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) made to the Auditor
