AN ACT

Amending the act of June 25, 1947 (P. L. 971), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the eighth class," increasing the compensation of auditors.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Eighth class counties.

Section 1. Subsection (d) of section 1, act of June 25, 1947 (P. L. 971), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the eighth class," amended September 8, 1959 (P. L. 841) and December 22, 1959 (P. L. 2017), is amended to read:

Subsection (d), section 1, act of June 25, 1947, P. L. 971, amended September 8, 1959, P. L. 841 and December 22, 1959, P. L. 2017, further amended.

Section 1. The annual salaries of the following county officers of counties of the eighth class shall be as follows:

* * * * *

(d) The county auditors shall each receive [twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50)] *fifteen dollars (\$15.00)* for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties, together with [six cents (6¢)] *ten cents (10¢)* per mile circular from and to their homes, once, each and every day so employed.

* * * * *

Section 2. This act shall become effective and applicable to all county auditors in counties of the eighth class, who shall be elected or appointed after the effective date of this act.
