

A SUPPLEMENT

HB 24

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P. L. 213), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making an appropriation for carrying the same into effect, providing for a tuition supplement to all full-time Pennsylvania resident students, providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated, and requiring reports to the members of the General Assembly.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the sum of thirty-nine million two hundred eighty-five thousand eight hundred dollars (\$39,285,800), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1966 to June 30, 1967, for the following purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For the general maintenance of instruction, research, and extension in the College of Agriculture, the College of Arts and Architecture, the College of Business Administration, the College of Engineering, the College of the Liberal Arts, the College of Home Economics, the College of Mineral Industries, the College of Science, the College of Education, the Graduate School, the College of Health and Physical Education, the Commonwealth Campuses, the Continuing Education Services and for the general maintenance of other schools, departments, offices and services, including repairs and improvements to the grounds and buildings, service of light, heat, power, water and sewage disposal, salaries and wages, materials, supplies, equipment, books and periodicals, insurance and interest and such other expenditures as the trustees may deem necessary and practicable; but the total sum of such expenditures shall not exceed thirty-five million seven hundred ninety-seven thousand dollars (\$35,797,000).

(2) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation to discover by-products of anthracite and bituminous coal and uses therefor; of developing new scientific, chemical, industrial, domestic and other uses and new and extended markets for anthracite coal and its products and for employing engineers, chemists, technical experts, assistants, clerks, stenographers, and other employes and

purchasing such machinery, supplies, equipment, apparatus, and other things necessary in the furtherance of the aforesaid research and investigation, to be used by the College of Mineral Industries under the supervision of the State Department of Mines and Mineral Industries. Moneys shall be expended for this purpose only to the extent that a sum equal to fifty percent of thirty-seven thousand eight hundred dollars (\$37,800) the amount to be expended by the Commonwealth, is contributed to The Pennsylvania State University by the members of the anthracite and bituminous coal industry. Affidavits evidencing such contributions shall be submitted by the university to the Auditor General.

(3) For the purpose of carrying on research and investigation of long-range problems affecting the mineral industries. No more shall be expended for this purpose than may be required to match an equal sum contributed to the university by one or more industries for such research and investigation. The total contribution by the Commonwealth shall not exceed thirty-one thousand fifty dollars (\$31,050). Affidavits evidencing such contribution shall be submitted by the university to the Auditor General.

(4) The support of research and investigation of basic problems affecting the slate and other nonmetallic mineral industries, eighteen thousand nine hundred dollars (\$18,900).

(5) For research in the diseases of maple trees, ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

(6) For the support of research and investigation of long-range basic problems affecting the mineral industries, seventeen thousand five hundred fifty dollars (\$17,550).

(7) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditures by the Agricultural Experiment Station for the support of research and investigation directed toward the development and production of superior strains of crops and livestock and to develop more efficient methods of producing and marketing such products, eighty-one thousand dollars (\$81,000).

(8) For the maintenance and the support of research and experimental investigation or problems relating to the petroleum industry of the State, seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000).

(9) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research in the communicable diseases of mushrooms, marketing, engineering and other phases of the mushroom industry, ninety-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$97,500).

(10) For the use of the College of Agriculture for expenditure by the Agricultural Experiment Station for research and investigation

of mastitis in the dairy cattle, twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000).

(11) (i) For the tuition supplement the sum of two million two hundred ninety-eight thousand dollars (\$2,298,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by The Pennsylvania State University starting July 1, 1966, solely for the purpose of continuing the reduced tuition and fee rate charged since January 1, 1966, to full-time Pennsylvania resident students in all schools and colleges of the university. The rate of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) per term at University Park and one hundred thirty dollars (\$130) per term at the Commonwealth Campuses shall continue for this fiscal period starting July 1, 1966, and ending June 30, 1967. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by The Pennsylvania State University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received from students.

(ii) For the tuition supplement the sum of eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000). The moneys so appropriated by this clause shall be applied by The Pennsylvania State University starting September 1, 1966, solely for the purpose of reducing the credit hour rate as follows: Fees for part-time students who are residents of Pennsylvania shall be sixteen dollars (\$16) per credit for all students at University Park Campus; fourteen dollars (\$14) per credit for all students at Commonwealth Campuses and Continuing Education Credit Centers; and twelve dollars (\$12) per unit for certificate students; and the fee charged per credit for nonresidents of Pennsylvania in these three categories shall be at least two and one-half times the fee per credit charged for residents of Pennsylvania. The funds appropriated under this clause may be used by The Pennsylvania State University for the same purposes as tuition and fees received by students.

Section 2. It shall be a condition of this appropriation that the quarter term tuition and fee rate charged to full-time nonresidents of Pennsylvania in all schools and colleges of the university shall be three hundred fifty dollars (\$350) per term.

Section 3. For the purpose of assuring the proper accountability on the part of The Pennsylvania State University for the expenditure of the amounts appropriated by this act, The Pennsylvania State University shall establish a Commonwealth Appropriation Account into which only the amounts appropriated by this act shall be credited when received. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys in the Commonwealth Appropriation Account only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than one hundred twenty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University

shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from both the Commonwealth Appropriation Account and other university accounts during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. In respect to expenditures made by the university from accounts other than the Commonwealth Appropriation Account, the Auditor General shall have the right of review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require. As to the moneys appropriated for the purposes specified in section 1, clause (11), the Auditor General shall determine that the required number of full-time Pennsylvania resident students have been charged the specified tuition rate, that the ratio of resident rates to nonresident rates prescribed by section 2 hereof have been maintained, and the bona fides of the residence of those claiming to be Pennsylvania residents.

Section 4. The colleges carrying out the research projects hereby authorized shall submit a complete report on each project to each member of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by June 30, 1967.

Section 5. It is the intent of the Legislature to provide funds to The Pennsylvania State University to have the normal annual tuition and fee rate for three terms to be four hundred fifty dollars (\$450) for full-time Pennsylvania resident students at University Park, and three hundred ninety dollars (\$390) for full-time Pennsylvania resident students at the Commonwealth Campuses.

HB 142

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs for certain capital improvements in accordance with long-range planning for capital improvements designed to make the most effective use of the State's available resources.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred forty-two thousand four hundred dollars (\$142,400), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Military Affairs for capital projects for the Armory Planning and Functions program, including various types of general improvements and alterations and construction at the State armories.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1968, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 308

Making an appropriation to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for payment into the Bituminous Coal Open Pit Mining Reclamation Fund, as additional funds to administer and enforce the act of May 31, 1945 (P. L. 1198), as amended.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of five hundred thirteen thousand four hundred seventy-five dollars (\$513,475), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for payment into the Bituminous Coal Open Pit Mining Reclamation Fund, to provide additional funds to administer and enforce the Bituminous Coal Open Pit Mining Conservation Act, the act of May 31, 1945 (P. L. 1198), as amended.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 108

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Instruction to be used by its Bureau of Special Education for the payment of salaries of personnel of the Beacon Lodge Camp for the Blind, Lewistown, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of thirteen thousand five hundred dollars (\$13,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, to the Department of Public Instruction to be used by its Bureau of Special Education for the payment of the salaries of personnel of the Beacon Lodge Camp for the Blind, Lewistown, Pennsylvania.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

SB 18

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare for construction and renovation of youth forestry camps at sites designated by the Secretary of Forests and Waters.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for construction and renovation of youth forestry camps at such sites as shall be designated by the Secretary of the Department of Forests and Waters.

Section 2. Whatsoever of the amount herein appropriated is unexpended or unencumbered as of June 30, 1968, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 129

Making an appropriation to the Erie County Volunteer Firemen's Association, Incorporated, for the purpose of establishing and operating a regional training school for firemen.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of three thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$3,750), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Erie County Volunteer Firemen's Association, Incorporated, for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the purpose of establishing, equipping and operating a regional training school for the education and training of firemen in conjunction with and at Edinboro State College, Edinboro, Pennsylvania.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

SB 124

Making an appropriation to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for the restoration of a covered bridge located in Hills Grove Township, Sullivan County.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of thirty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$32,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for the repair and restoration of the covered bridge carrying township route #357 over the Loyalsock Creek in Hills Grove Township, Sullivan County.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 1. The sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Philadelphia Musical Academy for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for maintenance and the purchase of supplies and equipment.

The sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Pennsylvania College of Optometry, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the general maintenance of the college and the purchase of such supplies, apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the college.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

The sum of one hundred eighty-eight thousand two hundred thirty-two dollars (\$188,232), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for maintenance and the purchase of apparatus, supplies and equipment.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the College of Lincoln University, Chester County.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of six hundred thirty-four thousand three hundred twenty-five dollars (\$634,325), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the College of Lincoln University, Chester County, for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the general maintenance of the university and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the university.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 41

Amending the act of September 14, 1965 (Appropriation Act No. 60A), entitled "An act making an appropriation to the Elwyn School at Elwyn in the County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and prescribing certain conditions upon which the appropriation will be available to the school," changing the number of wards to be maintained and the cost per capita.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of September 14, 1965 (Appropriation Act No. 60A), entitled "An act making an appropriation to the Elwyn School at Elwyn in the County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and prescribing certain conditions upon which the appropriation will be available to the school," is amended to read:

Section 1. The sum of one million seven hundred eighty-two thousand eight hundred twenty-five dollars (\$1,782,825), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Elwyn School at Elwyn in the County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for the maintenance of [eight hundred twenty-five]

seven hundred twenty-five wards of the Commonwealth, at [two thousand one hundred sixty-one dollars (\$2,161)] two thousand four hundred fifty-nine dollars (\$2,459) per capita, for the fiscal year July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1966. This appropriation shall be available to pay the actual expense of maintenance of the wards of the Commonwealth at the institution, computed in accordance with generally recognized accounting standards approved by the Auditor General, but not in excess of the maximum amount per capita hereinabove provided. Absences or vacations of three weeks or less in any fiscal year shall not be deducted, but any absences or vacations in excess of three weeks in any fiscal year shall be deducted.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 1. The sum of seven hundred fifty-eight thousand two hundred dollars (\$758,200), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania, located at East Falls, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the support and promotion of medical education for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, to be paid according to law.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making appropriations to the Trustees of Drexel Institute of Technology of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two million twenty-five thousand nine hundred eight dollars (\$2,025,908), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Drexel Institute of Technology of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the general maintenance of the institute and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the institute.

Section 2. The sum of one hundred forty-nine thousand two hundred twenty-nine dollars (\$149,229), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Drexel Institute of Technology of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the Library School.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Section 1. The sum of two million two hundred twenty-nine thousand nine hundred dollars (\$2,229,900), or as ¹ much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Jefferson Medical College of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July

1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for the general maintenance of the medical college and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interests of the medical college.

Making an appropriation for the maintenance, repair, improvement, management, development and administration of the Port of Erie.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Erie Port Commission of the City of Erie, for the maintenance, repair, improvement, management, development and administration of the Port of Erie for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967.

The moneys so appropriated shall only be expended as authorized and directed by the Council of the City of Erie and shall be drawn from the State Treasury upon warrants drawn by the Auditor General upon requisition by the Director of the Erie Port Commission of said city.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Instruction for library services for the blind.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred sixty-five thousand six hundred eighty-one dollars (\$165,681), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, to the Department of Public Instruction, to provide aid to the Free Library of Philadelphia and the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh, to meet the costs incurred in serving as regional libraries in the distribution of blind reading materials and talking book machines.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 125

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health for research at the Lankenau Hospital, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on problems of aging.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000), is hereby appropriated to the Department of Health for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, for research at the Lankenau Hospital, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on the problems of aging.

Section 2. (a) The sum appropriated by this act shall be used by the Lankenau Hospital to conduct research, both clinical and basic, in the field of aging. Such research shall include (1) an experimental community geriatric clinic for the multidisciplinary evaluation of the aging individual in health and disease with emphasis on preventive health maintenance, early diagnosis of disease, assessment of total performance, capacity fitness for work and retirement, which will be available for all patients who may benefit from the service within the capacity of this clinic, (2) a research ward with beds devoted to controlled nutritional balance studies for specific projects related to chronic diseases of the older individual such as osteoporosis, cardio-vascular ¹ disorders, aging, connective tissue disorders and disturbances in the skeletal-muscular system, (3) studies on the physiology of aging with particular reference to the development of criteria and practical tests for the assessment of functional

capacity and biological aging, and (4) basic biological research with particular reference to such aspects as genetic factors in aging, the role of physical activity in age changes and longitudinal studies covering the entire life span and cellular changes accompanying the aging process.

(b) To implement the provisions of this act the hospital may establish a center for aging research and may for that purpose use the moneys hereby appropriated.

Section 3. The Department of Health shall ascertain that the funds appropriated by this act are used by the Lankenau Hospital for the purposes set forth in the act.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

HB 128

Making an appropriation for the maintenance, repair and improvement of the Port of Philadelphia.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Port Operations of the City of Philadelphia, for the maintenance, repair and improvement of the Port of Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967.

The moneys so appropriated shall only be expended as authorized and directed by the Council of the City of Philadelphia, and shall be drawn from the State Treasury upon warrants drawn by the Auditor General upon requisition by the Chief of the Bureau of Port Operations of said city.

The sum of one million seven hundred eighty-two thousand eight hundred twenty-five dollars (\$1,782,825), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Elwyn School at Elwyn in the County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for the maintenance of six hundred wards of the Commonwealth, at two thousand nine hundred seventy-one dollars (\$2,971), per capita for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967. Absences or vacations of three weeks or less in any fiscal year shall not be deducted, but any absences or vacations in excess of three weeks in any fiscal year shall be deducted.

Section 2. The appropriation made by this act is made on the condition that every mental defective admitted to the Elwyn School, after the effective date of this act, and who is a ward of the Common-

wealth (1) shall be selected by the Department of Public Welfare from a list submitted from time to time to the department by the board of directors of the institution, and (2) shall have been previously investigated by the Department of Revenue for the purpose of determining the extent, if any, such mental defective, or those legally liable for his or her support, may be financially able to pay the cost of the maintenance of the person in the school.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare for the maintenance of certain hospitals.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of five hundred ninety-five thousand six hundred eight dollars (\$595,608), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, to be paid to the hospitals hereinafter designated in the amounts hereinafter specified for the purpose of the maintenance of such hospitals in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Public Welfare and the Department of the Auditor General as prescribed by law, at the rate of twelve dollars (\$12) per diem, but not to exceed the regularly established ward rate, nursery rate, pediatric rate or any lesser rate contracted between the hospital and the patient for the medical and surgical services rendered to and maintenance of persons treated in the hospital who are entitled to free service, such rates to include only room, board and general bed care but not to exceed rates charged other classes of patients or the actual cost to the hospital of such services and maintenance, whichever is the least, and all moneys received on account of the care of the patient shall be reported as a credit against the gross earnings of free and part-pay service chargeable against this appropriation: Provided, That no payment shall be made from this appropriation for services rendered by any hospital hereinafter designated that is qualified to receive payments for medical assistance under the Public Assistance Law: And provided further, That if a hospital is qualified to receive medical assistance payments only for services rendered patients aged

sixty-five and over, payments may be made from this appropriation for services rendered patients who are under sixty-five years of age.

Whereas, It is important to the delineation of the cultural heritage of Pennsylvania that the contributions of all these groups should be collected and preserved to properly and fully make available resources from which the history of the Commonwealth must be written; and

Whereas, It is desirable to set up a central archive for the folklore and culture of these groups as a part of the State historical and archival collections housed in the William Penn Memorial Archives; and

Whereas, Pennsylvania historians lacking these resources have tended to stress political and economic affairs rather than the rich cultural heritage of the Commonwealth and this situation can be remedied only by the collecting, organizing, and indexing of such material and its use; therefore

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for the purpose of initiating a program to collect information and source material bearing upon the cultural and historical contributions of all major ethnic groups in Pennsylvania.

The sum of three hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$330,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund and the sum of four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the Aviation Fuel Tax Account separately segregated in the Motor License Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1966, to June 30, 1967, to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics, for the development and maintenance of State airports, for assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities of the Commonwealth in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities, including the making of surveys and plans and the necessary construction work and equipment. L. 1242), as amended.

Section 2. The Secretary of Highways shall enter into all necessary contracts and agreements with the proper agencies of the government of the United States, and shall do all things necessary and proper in order to obtain the benefits afforded under the provisions of the act of Congress, approved the twenty-second day of October, 1965, entitled "An act to provide for scenic development and road beautification of the Federal-aid highway systems," Title III, section 301 (section 319 of Title 23, United States Code as revised).

Section 3. The General Fund shall be reimbursed for such sums appropriated herein from moneys received from Federal agencies in accordance with the above cited Federal act.
