AN ACT

SB 1127

Amending the act of February 1, 1966 (P. L. 1656), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," authorizing the appropriation of funds for urban common carrier mass transportation purposes and the making of agreements for such purposes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1202, act of February 1, 1966 (P. L. 1656), known as "The Borough Code," is amended by adding after clause (73), a new clause to read:

Section 1202. Specific Powers.—The powers of the borough shall be vested in the corporate authorities. Among the specific powers of the borough shall be the following, and in the exercise of any of such powers involving the enactment of any ordinance or the making of any regulation, restriction or prohibition, the borough may provide for the enforcement thereof and may prescribe penalties for the violation thereof or for the failure to conform thereto:

\* \* \*

(73.1) Appropriations for Urban Common Carrier Mass Transportation. To appropriate funds for urban common carrier mass transportation purposes from current revenues and to make annual contributions to county departments of transportation or to urban common carrier mass transportation authorities to assist the depart-

ments or the authorities to meet costs of operation, maintenance, capital improvements, and debt service, and to enter into long-term agreements providing for the payment of the said contributions.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 762

Amending the act of October 27, 1955 (P. L. 744), entitled, as amended, "An act prohibiting certain practices of discrimination because of race, color, religious creed, ancestry, age or national origin by employers, employment agencies, labor organizations and others as herein defined; creating the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission in the Department of Labor and Industry; defining its functions, powers and duties; providing for procedure and enforcement; providing for formulation of an educational program to prevent prejudice; providing for judicial review and enforcement and imposing penalties," extending provisions of the act to employers of four or more persons and to exclude employes who reside in the personal residence of the employer and providing enforcement and penalty provisions.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 4, act of October 27, 1955 (P. L. 744), known as the "Pennsylvania Human Relations Act," amended January 24, 1966 (P. L. 1525), is amended to read:

Section 4. Definitions.—As used in this act unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:

\* \* \*

(b) The term "employer" includes the Commonwealth or any political subdivision or board, department, commission or school district thereof and any person employing [six] four or more persons within the Commonwealth, but except as hereinafter provided, does not include religious, fraternal, charitable or sectarian corporations or associations, except such corporations or associations supported, in whole or in part, by governmental appropriations. The term "employer" with respect to discriminatory practices based on race, color, age or national origin, includes religious, fraternal, charitable and sectarian corporations and associations employing [six] four or more persons within the Commonwealth.
