of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eighteenth article thereof:

That section thirty-one, article three of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be amended to read:

Section 31. Delegation of Certain Powers Prohibited.—The General Assembly shall not delegate to any special commission, private corporation or association, any power to make, supervise or interfere with any municipal improvement, money, property or effects, whether held in trust or otherwise, or to levy taxes or perform any municipal function whatever.

Notwithstanding the foregoing limitation or any other provision of the Constitution, the General Assembly may enact laws which provide that the findings of panels or commissions, selected and acting in accordance with law for the adjustment or settlement of grievances or disputes or for collective bargaining between policemen and firemen and their public employers shall be binding upon all parties and shall constitute a mandate to the head of the political subdivision which is the employer, or to the appropriate officer of the Commonwealth if the Commonwealth is the employer, with respect to matters which can be remedied by administrative action, and to the lawmaking body of such political subdivision or of the Commonwealth, with respect to matters which require legislative action, to take the action necessary to carry out such findings.

(This Joint Resolution No. 10 was passed for the first time at the Legislative Session of 1967.)

## A JOINT RESOLUTION

## **SB11**

Proposing an amendment to article two, section six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for the holding of other civil offices by Senators and Representatives.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of the eighteenth article thereof:

That section six, article two of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be amended to read:

Section 6. Disqualification to Hold Other Office.—No Senator or Representative shall, [during the time for which he was elected, be appointed to] at the same time hold the office of Senator or Representative and any civil office under this Commonwealth, to which a salary, fee or perquisite is attached. No member of Congress or other person holding any office (except of attorney-at-law or in the National Guard or in a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States) under the United States or this Commonwealth to which a salary, fee or perquisite is attached shall be a member of either House during his continuance in office.
