

Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 5, act of June 5, 1957 (P. L. 248), known as the "Pennsylvania Pesticide Act of 1957," is amended to read:

Section 5. Registration.—\* \* \*

(b) Each pesticide shall be registered with the secretary before being offered for sale, sold or otherwise distributed in this Commonwealth. The application for registration shall be submitted to the secretary on forms which he shall supply, and shall be accompanied by a fee of [seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) per brand, for the first ten brands registered and two dollars (\$2) per brand for each brand registered in excess thereof] ten dollars (\$10) per brand. Upon approval by the secretary, a copy of the registration shall be furnished to the applicant. All registrations shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of each year. The registration fees and fines, when collected, shall be [placed in the Feed and Fertilizer Fund to be administered by the secretary] paid into the State Treasury and shall be credited to the general government operations appropriation of the Department of Agriculture for the payment of the costs of inspection, sampling, analysis and other expenses necessary for the administration of this act.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 1886

Amending the act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code, the Tractor Code, the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership, possession and use of vehicles and tractors," changing certain penalties.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1015, act of April 29, 1959 (P. L. 58), known as "The Vehicle Code," amended July 29, 1965 (P. L. 259), is amended to read:

Section 1015. What to Do on Approach of Ambulance, Police, Fire Department or River Rescue Vehicle.—

(a) Upon the approach of any police, fire department vehicle, ambulance, or the private vehicle of the chief of any fire department, assistant chief of any fire department, fire marshal or commanders of any river rescue organizations who, in accordance with a statement filed with the Pennsylvania State Police prior thereto, uses the same for answering fire or emergency calls, giving audible signal, the driver of every other vehicle shall immediately drive the same to a position as near as possible, and parallel to, the right-hand edge or curb of the highway, clear of any intersection of highways, and shall stop and remain in such position, unless otherwise directed by a peace officer, until such vehicle shall have passed.

(b) It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, streetcar, or trackless trolley omnibus, other than one on official business, to follow any fire apparatus traveling in response to a fire alarm closer than five hundred (500) feet, or to park such vehicle within five hundred (500) feet of where fire apparatus has stopped in answer to a fire alarm.

(c) Upon the approach of any police, fire department vehicle, ambulance, or the private vehicle of the chief of any fire department, assistant chief of any fire department, fire marshal or commanders of any river rescue organizations who, in accordance with a statement filed with the Pennsylvania State Police prior thereto, uses the same for answering fire or emergency calls, giving audible signal, the operator of every streetcar or trackless trolley omnibus shall immediately stop and remain in such position, unless otherwise directed by a peace officer, until such vehicle shall have passed.

Penalty.—Any person violating any of the provisions of this section, shall, upon summary conviction before a magistrate, be sentenced to pay a fine of [ten dollars (\$10.00)] not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) and not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs of prosecution, and, in default of the payment thereof, shall undergo imprisonment for not more than [five (5)] ten (10) days.

SB 1111

Authorizing and directing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to transfer the jurisdiction and control from the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Highways 7.4885 acres of land, situate in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, providing for the valuation thereof and making an appropriation.
