

(a) Upon the approach of any police, fire department vehicle, ambulance, or the private vehicle of the chief of any fire department, assistant chief of any fire department, fire marshal or commanders of any river rescue organizations who, in accordance with a statement filed with the Pennsylvania State Police prior thereto, uses the same for answering fire or emergency calls, giving audible signal, the driver of every other vehicle shall immediately drive the same to a position as near as possible, and parallel to, the right-hand edge or curb of the highway, clear of any intersection of highways, and shall stop and remain in such position, unless otherwise directed by a peace officer, until such vehicle shall have passed.

(b) It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, streetcar, or trackless trolley omnibus, other than one on official business, to follow any fire apparatus traveling in response to a fire alarm closer than five hundred (500) feet, or to park such vehicle within five hundred (500) feet of where fire apparatus has stopped in answer to a fire alarm.

(c) Upon the approach of any police, fire department vehicle, ambulance, or the private vehicle of the chief of any fire department, assistant chief of any fire department, fire marshal or commanders of any river rescue organizations who, in accordance with a statement filed with the Pennsylvania State Police prior thereto, uses the same for answering fire or emergency calls, giving audible signal, the operator of every streetcar or trackless trolley omnibus shall immediately stop and remain in such position, unless otherwise directed by a peace officer, until such vehicle shall have passed.

Penalty.—Any person violating any of the provisions of this section, shall, upon summary conviction before a magistrate, be sentenced to pay a fine of [ten dollars (\$10.00)] not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) and not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs of prosecution, and, in default of the payment thereof, shall undergo imprisonment for not more than [five (5)] ten (10) days.

AN ACT

SB 1111

Authorizing and directing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to transfer the jurisdiction and control from the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Highways 7.4885 acres of land, situate in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, providing for the valuation thereof and making an appropriation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to transfer the jurisdiction and control now in the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Highways of the following described tract of land, situate in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the Easterly legal right-of-way line of Legislative Route 21096, (First Street), said point being offset at right angles 20.49 feet from centerline Station 19+72; thence, along the lands now or formerly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Agriculture North 51 degrees, 54 minutes, 45 seconds East a distance of 495.60 feet to a point; thence, continuing along the same lands now or formerly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Agriculture North 18 degrees, 24 minutes, 15 seconds, a distance of 749.53 feet to a point (said point being offset at right angles 12.60 feet from the centerline of proposed Legislative Route 1005-3 and said point also being in the Easterly line of Railroad Avenue, T. R. 685); thence, along the Easterly side of Railroad Avenue, Traffic Route 685, relocated, South 30 degrees, 01 minutes West a distance of 805.20 feet to a point; thence, along the Easterly side of Legislative Route 21096 (First Street) South 37 degrees, 57 minutes East a distance of 405.46 feet to a point of beginning. Containing in all 7.4885 acres of land.

Being a part of the same premises which were conveyed to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by deed of Manor Real Estate & Trust Company, dated September 13, 1923, and recorded in Cumberland County Deed Book "V," No. 9, Page 82.

The transfer shall be made under and subject, nevertheless, to all easements, servitudes and rights of others, including, but not confined to, streets, roadways, and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas, or pipeline companies, as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estate or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Section 2. The Department of Property and Supplies and the Department of Highways shall each appoint a competent real estate appraiser who shall determine the market value of the land transferred under the provisions of this act. There are hereby appropriated for transfer from the Motor License Fund to the General Fund such sums of money as may be determined by the appraisers to be the value of the land.

Section 3. The deed of transfer of jurisdiction shall be approved by the Department of Agriculture as well as the Department of Justice and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies

in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, with the approval of the Governor.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

SB 1114

Authorizing and directing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, to transfer the jurisdiction and control from the Department of Military Affairs to the Department of Highways five acres of land, situate in East Hanover Township, Lebanon County, Pennsylvania, providing for the valuation thereof and making an appropriation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to transfer the jurisdiction and control now in the Department of Military Affairs to the Department of Highways of the following described tract of land, situate in East Hanover Township, Lebanon County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point, said point being offset seventy-three and sixty-seven one-hundredths feet at right angles in a northerly direction from the centerline Station 73 + 16.50 of Township Road 607 reloc.; thence north fifteen degrees, sixteen minutes, forty-three seconds east along the lands now or formerly of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, (Department of Military Affairs) a distance of four hundred thirty and twenty-one one-hundredths feet to a point; thence south eighty-three degrees, forty minutes, forty-three seconds west along same lands now or formerly of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Department of Military Affairs) a distance of six hundred twenty-three and sixty-nine one-hundredths feet to a point; thence south six degrees, nineteen minutes, seventeen seconds east along the same lands now or formerly of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Department of Military Affairs) a distance of four hundred feet to a point; thence north eighty-three degrees, forty minutes, forty-three seconds east along the same lands now or formerly of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Department of Military Affairs) a distance of four hundred sixty-five and thirty-two one-hundredths feet to the point of beginning. Containing five acres.
