SB 940

Providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1969-1970.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Construction.—This act and its supplements shall constitute the “Capital Budget Act for 1969-1970.” The provisions and definitions of the act of July 20, 1968 (Act No. 217), known as the “Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act,” unless inconsistent herewith, shall apply.

Section 2. Overall Limitations on Debt to be Incurred for Capital Projects.—The maximum principal amount of additional debt to be incurred hereafter during the 1969-1970 fiscal year and thereafter until the enactment of the 1970-1971 capital budget specifying such maximum debt for the 1970-1971 fiscal year, for capital projects specifically itemized in a capital budget pursuant to clause (4) of subsection (a) of section 7 of Article VIII of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, and the fund to be charged with the repayment of such debt shall, with respect to each category of capital project, be as follows:

Category	Amount	Fund
(1) Community College Projects	\$ 15,000,000	General Fund
(2) Highway Projects	250,000,000	Motor License Fund
(3) Public Improvement Projects	159,500,000	General Fund
(4) Transportation Assistance Projects	17,500,000	General Fund
Total	\$442,000,000	

Section 3. Constitutional Construction.—The provisions of this act shall be severable and, if any of the provisions thereof shall be held unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative intent that this act would have been adopted had such unconstitutional provisions not been included herein.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire on June 30, 1970, or upon the enactment of the 1970-1971 capital budget whichever later occurs.
