AN ACT

HB 1352

Amending the act of May 28, 1915 (P.L.596), entitled "An act requiring cities of the second class to establish a pension fund for employes of said cities, and regulating the administration and the payment of such pensions," requiring certain employes to join and make contributions to the pension fund and authorizing back payments and credit for former service by such employes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 6, act of May 28, 1915 (P.L.596), entitled "An act requiring cities of the second class to establish a pension fund for employes of said cities, and regulating the administration and the payment of such pensions," amended June 10, 1947 (P.L.524), is amended to read:

Section 6. (a) Should any person holding position in said cities of the second class as laborer, at a per diem wage, he or she shall not be compelled to pay or contribute toward the pension fund herein provided for, but shall have the option or choice of so doing at any time within six months after the date of their employment, and, in that event only, of becoming entitled to the pension provided by this act.

(b) Every new full time employe except as provided in subsection (a) of this section shall after serving a ninety (90) day probation period be required to join the pension fund and shall thereafter make contributions to such fund as provided in section five of this act.

(c) Any city employe who holds a position as a school guard or meter maid shall, within thirty (30) days after the passage of this act, be required to join the pension fund and shall thereafter make contributions to such fund as provided in section five of this act. Every new employe holding a position of school guard or meter maid shall, after completing six (6) months of continuous employment, be required to join the pension fund and shall thereafter make contributions to such fund as provided in section five of this act.

(d) Any city employe who holds a position as a school guard or meter maid, upon joining the pension fund, shall have the option of making back payments at the same rate as if she had been a member of the pension fund during the period of her employment as a school guard or meter maid, in a lump sum or by installments over a one (1) year period, in a manner to be determined by the pension board, and shall receive full credit towards her pension, provided she produces proof satisfactory to the pension board of the number of years of such service.

Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 1970.
