Repealing sections 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 of the act of May 31, 1841 (P.L.415), entitled "Supplement to an act entitled an act to incorporate the town of New Castle, in the county of Mercer, and the town of Blairsville, in the county of Indiana, passed twenty-fifth March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and for other purposes," abolishing the right of persons to bring suit against Philadelphia to recover damages for destruction of real or personal property by mob or riot.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 of the act of May 31, 1841 (P.L.415), entitled "Supplement to an act entitled an act to incorporate the town of New Castle, in the county of Mercer, and the town of Blairsville, in the county of Indiana, passed twenty-fifth March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and for other purposes," are repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
