Amending the act of June 24, 1939 (P.L.872), entitled "An act to consolidate, amend and revise the penal laws of the Commonwealth," changing the penalty for wilful obstructions to streams.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 925, act of June 24, 1939 (P.L.872), known as "The Penal Code," is amended to read:

Section 925. Wilful Obstructions to Streams.—Whoever wilfully throws into, or causes to be thrown or placed, so that the same may slide or be washed into any navigable stream of this Commonwealth, used for the purpose of floating, running or manufacturing lumber, or into any tributary flowing into such stream or streams, any slabs, edgings, driftwood, brush, stumps, logs or trees, **[is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500), or undergo imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months, or both]** *shall, upon summary conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500), or to undergo imprisonment for not more than three (3) months, or both.*
