

IN THE NAME AND BY AUTHORITY OF THE



PROCLAMATION

By virtue of the authority vested in me by Article II, Section 4; Article IV, Section 12; and Article III, Section 12; of the Constitution, I, Milton J. Shapp, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby convene the General Assembly in special and extraordinary session, to meet in the Capitol, at Harrisburg, on Monday, August 14, 1972, at 12:00 o'clock noon, to consider legislation upon the following subjects:

1. Reimbursement of volunteer fire companies for equipment and building losses sustained as a result of flood waters.
2. Municipal tax abatement for property lost or damaged by flood waters.
3. Flood plain zoning.
4. Authorization of an emergency bond issue for rehabilitation in areas affected by the flood of June, 1972.
5. Unemployment compensation problems created by the flood of June, 1972.
6. Allowing local governments to participate in or to obtain the benefit of any state contracts appropriate to their operations.
7. Creation of a Pennsylvania Housing Assistance Agency and definition of its powers.
8. Site development planning by the Commonwealth.
9. Consideration of the final report of the Commonwealth Compensation Commission issued June 22, 1972.
10. Amendments to the Industrial Development Authority Act to expand the provisions of the present act and make it applicable to Disaster Relief Projects.
11. Amendments to the Constitution of Pennsylvania to enable the Commonwealth to give grants to and guaranty loans for individuals, including farmers, who suffered major damage as a result of the flood of June, 1972.
