AN ACT

SB 408

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating thereto," changing the expenses that may be paid to supervisors, superintendents or roadmasters for attending road meetings or conventions.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (h) of section 516, act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), known as "The Second Class Township Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567), and amended July 1, 1969 (P.L.115, No.47), is amended to read:

Section 516. Duties of Supervisors, Township Superintendents, and Roadmasters.—The township supervisors, or the supervisors employed as superintendents or roadmasters, shall—

* * *

(h) Attend road meetings and conventions authorized by the provisions of this act when directed to do so by the board of supervisors. Any supervisor, elected or appointed officer or qualified township employe may, if directed by the board of supervisors, attend any conference, institute or school conducted within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in order to discuss and resolve the various questions arising in the discharge of the duties and functions of the respective officers and employes, and to provide uniform, efficient and economical methods of administering their township duties. The expenses for attending the conferences, institutes and schools may be paid by the township and shall be limited to the registration fee, mileage at the rate of [ten cents (10¢)] *twelve cents (12¢)* per circular mile, [and room and board at the rate of twenty dollars (\$20)] *and thirty-five dollars (\$35)* per day.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
