SB 830

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto,"¹ increasing the compensation of supervisors.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 515, act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), known as "The Second Class Township Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567), and amended October 26, 1972 (P.L.1034, No.256), is amended to read:

Section 515. Compensation of Supervisors.—Supervisors may receive from the general township fund, as compensation, [~~fifteen~~] *twenty-five* dollars for each meeting which they attend. The compensation of supervisors, when acting as superintendents, roadmasters or laborers, shall be fixed by the township auditors either per hour, per day, per week, semi-monthly or monthly, which compensation shall not exceed compensation paid in the locality for similar services, and such other reasonable compensation for the use of a passenger car, or a two-axled four-wheeled motor truck having a chassis weight of less than two thousand pounds and a maximum gross weight of five thousand pounds, or a class 2 truck, having a maximum gross weight of seven thousand pounds when required and actually used for the transportation of road and bridge laborers and their hand tools and for the distribution of cinders and patching material from a stock pile, as the auditors shall determine and approve; but no supervisor shall receive compensation as a superintendent or roadmaster for any day he receives compensation for attending a meeting of supervisors, unless such meeting is held after regular working hours.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
