## AN ACT

HB 1319

Amending the act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.932, No.317), entitled "An act relating to cities of the third class; and amending, revising, and consolidating the law relating thereto," eliminating certain restrictions on the construction or improvement of public streets.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1918, act of June 23, 1931 (P.L.932, No.317), known as "The Third Class City Code," reenacted and amended June 28, 1951 (P.L.662, No.164), and added August 21, 1953 (P.L.1292, No.364), is amended to read:

Section 1918. Street Construction and Improvement by City Employes.—[Any] Whenever a city [may use] uses the work or services of its employes in the construction or improvement, [for a distance of not over six hundred (600) feet,] of any public street within the territorial limits, [but] it shall be subject to the limitations and duties imposed by this article in the purchase of any materials for such construction or improvement. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to affect or limit the provisions of Article XXIX of this act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
